ADDENDUM- In part, due to the pandemic we continue to endure, we have made an addendum to the Policy for the Protection of Children and Young People-July 2020. This addendum (*see attachment*) refers to and clarifies Appendix D (Code of Conduct) Section IV-19 in your Diocesan Policy Handbook. Please print the attached and put with your Safe Environment Policy/Program to use as a reference. If you have any questions, please contact the Safe Environment Office. We will send out the official addendum with a page number, new table of contents, etc., when we update the Diocesan Handbook at a later date.

PARISH AND SCHOOL AUDITS- In 2019 the Safe Environment Office concluded the first 3-year cycle of Parish and School On-Site Audits. In Spring of 2020, it was decided to do some parish/school trainings in the different deaneries instead of the on-site audits, but that came to a sudden halt as the pandemic hit. Fortunately, we were able to complete those trainings through Zoom meetings.

It is now time to start to start the 3 year-cycle over. With the pandemic still in our forefront and now hitting parish communities in the western part of our diocese, and who knows where it will hit next, I have decided at this time, it would be best to conduct the audits through Zoom. The format of the meeting will be similar in scope and nature to previous audits, except we will not be face to face. I have been contacting the Safety Coordinators in each parishes and schools in the West Deanery plus those in Manhattan, Ogden and Junction City to start scheduling these Zoom meetings. If you have not yet been contacted to schedule a meeting, please let me know. Thank you for your cooperation and your continued support as we Promise to Protect, Pledge to Heal.

WHEN IN DOUBT MAKE A REPORT- If anyone in the Diocese has questions regarding how to report abuse, when to report abuse, or if you should report abuse, please contact Maria Cheney, our Victim Assistance Coordinator and advocate for the diocese. Maria will guide you through the reporting process and answer any questions you may have. DIOCESAN YOUTH CONVENTION: Our convention will be the weekend of March 20-21, 2021.

JUNIOR CYO CAMP: This camp is held at Rock Springs Ranch around Junction City. We usually have around 300 6th, 7th and 8th graders attend this camp. Our counselors are seniors in high school and college age students. During the day the junior high youth do the activities of the camp and in the evening, we have the college age students give talks on our theme that we develop during the camp.

CARES ACT – Charitable tax benefits

The following is reprinted from an earlier SDNB. With the end of the year approaching, it's good to remember this and to pass this information to your parishioners. If you have any questions, contact Beth Shearer at beth.shearer@salinadiocese.org.

The federal legislation that created the Payroll Protection Program (PPP) loans has also created several charitable tax benefits for giving. This could make a difference for many of your parishioners as they start to consider their tax consequences, usually later in the year. Note these changes seem to be just for this 2020 tax year. You can share the following and be sure to add the disclaimer similar to the one printed below.

Temporary Universal Charitable Deduction for 2020 Tax Year

This deduction allows taxpayers who do not currently itemize their deductions to claim a charitable deduction for cash donations up to \$300 through December 31. The \$300 cap applies to individuals and married couples equally, i.e., a married couple would not be able to take a \$600 deduction. Donations to donor advised funds and supporting organizations are not eligible for this deduction.

AGI Charitable Deduction Caps Suspended or Increased for 2020 Tax Year

The adjusted gross income (AGI) limits on charitable donations are suspended or increased for cash gifts made by individuals and corporations. The 60% AGI cap for individual taxpayers who itemize has been suspended. Taxpayers who itemize are eligible to take charitable deductions for donations up to 100% of their AGI for the 2020 tax year. The AGI cap for corporations has been increased from 10% to 25% for corporate tax years ending in 2020. Donations to private foundations and donor advised funds are not eligible for the increase or suspension of AGI limits.

Catholic Charities will host the 3rd Annual Adoption Mass at noon on Friday, November 6, **2020.** Bishop Vincke will celebrate Mass at the Sacred Heart Cathedral in Salina in honor of National Adoption Awareness month. The Mass is open to the public and families and individuals touched by adoption are encouraged to attend.

OFFICE OF RESPECT LIFE

2021 MARCH FOR LIFE IN WASHINGTON, D.C. will take place January 29th, 2021. There will be a Salina Diocese sponsored pilgrimage again in 2021 but it will look different than past years. With uncertainty caused by the pandemic it was decided to NOT charter busses for the 25+ hour trip because confining a large group of people in a bus is not advisable at this time. The alternative to riding the bus is to fly to D.C. or drive yourself there! Airline tickets are currently priced at an affordable rate, but that will change quickly as the January event date draws closer. The Diocese **WILL NOT** purchase airline tickets, that is up to each individual or group to do on their own. The Diocese **WILL** provide hotel accommodations and transportation in D.C.!

The itinerary will look very different this year as well. Many of the activities such as the evening rallies and Mass with the other dioceses of Kansas are unlikely to happen. The pilgrimage will focus on the March itself and will still include a visit to the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, but other activities will be limited.

Plan on making travel arrangements to arrive in D.C. late afternoon/evening on Thursday, January 28th and depart from Reagan National Airport after 2:00 p.m. on Saturday, January 30th.

Expected cost per person for hotel and transportation in D.C. is \$200. The DEADLINE to register is NOVEMBER 20th, 2020 with two ways to register. Online registration is available, or you can mail in your registration. Full payment of \$200 is due with your registration. Make checks payable to Salina Diocese Respect Life Office and mailed to PO Box 980, Salina, KS 67402, attention: March for Life. Cost of travel must be paid by the individual. Registration forms, Medical/Waiver forms, are available on the diocesan Website.

ALL plans are subject to change as the ongoing pandemic makes it difficult to be assured of anything. When purchasing airline tickets be sure to ask about refundability or transferring the use of your ticket to a later date in the event we don't go.

DECREE

(Prot. No. GV2020-024)

In nomine Domini. Amen.

Concerning the Celebration of Christmas Eve Masses 2020

Whereas the Code of Canon Law allows for the celebration of Feast Day Masses on the feast day itself or in the evening of the preceding day (CIC canon 1248, § 1) and the commonly held canonical opinion is that "evening" is ordinarily defined as "4:00 PM or later."

Whereas the Instruction Eucharisticum mysteriam (May 25, 1976) affirmed that the scheduling of vigil Masses is within the competence of each local Ordinary to determine.

Whereas I have determined that because of COVID-19 a permission to celebrate anticipated Masses in the afternoon is warranted for the spiritual good of the faithful.

By this decree, I hereby grant in those Parishes where there is a legitimate need determined by the pastor to celebrate Christmas Eve Masses on December 24, 2020 beginning at 2:00 PM in the time zone where the Parish church is located.

This permission is granted only for Christmas Eve Masses in the year two thousand and twenty, anything to the contrary notwithstanding.

Given at the Chancery of the Diocese of Salina on this, the 28th day of October, in the year of our Lord, two thousand and twenty.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

Our parishes will be participating in the Retirement Fund for Religious collection the weekend of December 12–13. This annual appeal benefits more than 30,000 senior Catholic sisters, brothers, and religious order priests—women and men who have consecrated their lives to serving God and the Church.

In our Diocese men and women religious were instrumental in establishing Catholic schools, hospitals, and charitable agencies. Often this progress came at great sacrifice, and many older sisters, brothers, and religious order priests served for little to no pay.

ADDENDUM

Policy for the Protection of Children and Young People July 2020 In the policy, Appendix D (Code of Conduct) Section IV -19 states:

Maintaining proper supervision at all times. Ordinarily, this means having two qualified adults* present (must be at least 25 years of age** and trained- have Safe Environment Training and valid Background Check).

See below for clarification as it relates to Religious Education Classes/Youth Ministry

*Two qualified adults is ideal. We are all in survival mode, I realize getting qualified adults is a difficult task during "normal" times, now add to it the pandemic, when many of you are not even sure when or how Religious Education classes will look this year. If this is not possible, please provide safe environments for adults and students by ministering in areas visible to others and/or employ a hall monitor or rover and continue to adhere to and maintain professional and personal boundaries per your responsibilities to the Diocese of Salina.

In Religious Education Classes/Youth Ministry-

**Adults ministering to students in:

Grades K-8 -One adult must be at least 21 years of age, the other must be at least 18 years of age.

Grades 9-12 – One adult must be at least 25 years of age, the other must be at least 21 years of age.
