- 1. The Chrism Mass is at the cathedral, April 11 at 11:30 A.M. Oils will be distributed after lunch in the room west of the sacristy. Please bring your stocks there before Mass, along with a check for \$20 for each parish/institution. You may pick up your oils after lunch.
 - If possible, bring a few people along with you to officially bring the oils back to the parish. They could be the ones to bring them up in procession at the Mass of the Lord's Supper. Lunch will be served for all.
- 2. The Easter Vigil Mass should begin no earlier than 8:30 P.M.
- 3. As per the discussion at the recent Priests' Council meeting, pastors will no longer need to send to the Liturgy Office the names of extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion. Let us remember, though, the original reason for doing this: due diligence concerning careful choice for this ministry. These ministers should be regular about their participation in the Sunday Liturgies, have a sincere devotion to the Eucharist, and be in good standing with the Church. There will no longer be need to re-commission them every three years, though new ones should be commissioned. The order of commissioning may be found in the *Book of Blessings*, Nos. 1871 and following. A brief form of the commissioning can be found in the brochure, "Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion," produced by the Liturgy Office and found on the liturgy page of the diocesan website.

When making payments to **Selection.com** for background checks, please include the actual invoice that you are paying, and/or put the invoice # on your check. This will eliminate any confusion on the part of Selection.com. Thank you for your cooperation on this matter.

Please continue to monitor your CMGConnect database WEEKLY to be sure all employees, educators and volunteers have completed the training for your parish or school and are designated correctly in the database. As the school year winds down, and summer ramps up, it is important that the data base remains as current and up to date as possible. We will not be having an on-site audit this year, but will still need to send in our "numbers", so it is important that the data in CMG be up to date and accurate. EUCHARISTIC MINISTERS INVITED TO MINISTRY OF CARE TRAINING APRIL 6 AT THE SPIRITUAL LIFE CENTER - Bill and Joan Nelson of Our Lady of the Holy Rosary and Saint Leo parishes in Rochester New York officially launched the Mother Angeline Ministry of Care in their parish in 2009. Today they have 55 ministers who serve over 150 sick and dying parishioners by making weekly visits to parishioners who are homebound, residents at assisted living, nursing homes in the area and patients in the hospital and local hospices.

The Nelsons say "those we minister to light up when they feel engaged and valued, even if it's in simple ways like sharing hobbies and opinions." The consistent goal of the ministry is to provide spiritual care and give the elderly a sense of purpose. Their ministers are dedicated to preserving the dignity of the elderly and combating the fear the elderly have when they feel valueless in our society. The Nelsons are intent on bringing parishioners closer to God during ministry visits. For their Eucharistic ministers who are trained in this ministry, it's not just about bringing Holy Communion, it's about people seeing the face of Christ in our ministers and encouraging them to establish a bond with God."

As ministers interact with the sick or dying and comfort their loved ones, a kind of evangelization takes place. They have witnessed people return to the Church, go forward with receiving the sacraments and reconnect with their personal faith. They and their volunteers hope to convey to parishioners that there is merit in their suffering. They try to help them understand that God loves them and has not abandoned them. They aim to bring peace to parishioners on their deathbed and consider it "a beautiful grace to pray people into heaven."

The Holy Spirit is the guiding force of the Mother Angeline Ministries of Care. Ministers are encouraged to pray daily in order to "nourish their own souls and, in turn, nourish those whom they have been called to serve.

Three Carmelite Sisters for the Aged and Infirm from the Avila Institute of Gerontology in Germantown, New York will be coming to Wichita to train Eucharistic ministers and lay volunteers in how to make a pastoral visit instead of just a social visit to sick and dying parishioners in our diocese. The Mother Angeline Ministry of Care Training is on Saturday April 6, 8:30 A.M. – 3:30 P.M. at the Spiritual Life Center. The people in our diocese continue to respond generously to the 2019 Bishop's Annual Appeal. This year's themes, "Call to Share" along with the scripture verse "Behold, how good it is, and how pleasant, where humanity dwells as one" from Psalm 133:1, is inspiring many to support

the diverse ministries of the diocese. As this is typed, over \$998,000 has been pledged or received toward our \$1.4 million goal. This is great news, but we need to finish this out.

The In-Pew solicitation/Participation weekend is scheduled for April 6 and 7. Conducting the in-pew solicitation significantly increases participation and funds raised. 
Please refer to the parish manual for sample talking points for the celebrant to announce this appeal at each Mass. (See page 29 of the parish manual.) After the announcement, allow time for your parishioners to complete the pledge cards/envelopes. Before Mass, be sure that pledge cards/envelopes and brochures, if you have any left, are in the pews. After Mass, you just send the pledge cards in the envelopes to Lois Yost at the Chancery. She will process the gift. You do not need to do open the envelopes.

Remember, the **parish manual** that each pastor received has the schedule of activities, copies of materials, prayers of the faithful and other materials. Refer to it as needed.

Your leadership is key to this appeal's success. Thank you for all the work you are doing to promote it. At this mid-point of the effort, there are a few things to celebrate:

- The average gift is \$470, up from \$256 for the same period last year.
- 9% of responses have come from first time donors to the appeal. The average gift from these donors is \$320.
- Six first time donors made a first gift to the appeal at or above \$1,000.
- 25 parishes are over halfway to their goal, with two already over goal.

April is Child Abuse Prevention Month

April is designated as Child Abuse Prevention Month in the United States. Sadly, as many as 695,000 children are neglected or abused in our country each year.

The Diocese of Salina is committed to keeping children safe each and every day of the year, but during this month of April, we place extra focus on the prevention and awareness of safe environments, so everyone can simultaneously

focus on the abuse and prevention, including the Dioceses initiatives that are already in place. These efforts are part of the ongoing work of the Church in the United States to carry out the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People.

Child abuse and neglect is a national issue that affects us all. The consequences of child abuse and neglect ripple across the lifespan, negatively impacting a child's chances to succeed in school, work, and relationships.

These statistics can seem overwhelming, but each one of us has the ability to make a difference in the lives of children.

Working together, we can ensure that our Church offers an environment that is safe for all people.

As a Community of Faith

AWARENESS is the first step in understanding our responsibilities as members of God's family, and usually gives rise to the question "What can I do?"

Talk with your children about the dangers of child abuse and steps that can be taken to prevent it within your own parish communities during this month of April.

The Diocese of Salina's safe environment program is designed for adults in our faith community—to raise their awareness about the nature of child sexual abuse, to educate them on how to recognize the warning signs, and to train them about what to do when they suspect a child is being victimized. For more information about this program and other resources to assist parents and other adults in this endeavor, please contact the Office of Safety and Security at 785-827-8746.

Today, video chatting is commonplace. It's available on many platforms and is a routine way to communicate. It's time to educate our kids so they are ready for situations they may not anticipate themselves.

Imagine that your kids could use video chat to build close relationships with far-away loved ones – like their grandparents and their best friend who moved away. *And* at the same time they knew how to be safe from all the dangerous people and situations that can happen on video chat!

Since you can't actually touch someone over video chat, it may seem safer than actually hanging out in person. In some ways, this is true. However, it's important to think through the possibilities and help your child establish healthy boundaries for video calls.

With regular conversations and monitoring, your kids can enjoy the benefits and avoid the risks of video chat!

Remember: Safety Coordinators of Parishes and Schools-Please monitor the CMGConnect data base weekly, daily if necessary. The CMGConnect data base is for ACTIVE volunteers/employees and clergy currently ministering in your parish/school.

Safe Video Chat Rules to teach your kids.

- 1. Define your dress code
 - 2. Beware of too much
 - 3. No chatting in overly intimate spaces
 - 4. Remember everything can be recorded and shared
 - 5. Respect others' wishes
 - 6. Don't fall into a false sense of safety with familiar people
 - 7. Watch out for predators luring kids from gaming to on-on-one video chat
 - 8. Sextortion is rising dramatically
 - Don't accept video chat requests from people you don't know
 - 10. Put parental controls to work for you
 - 11. Prepare kids for the worst case scenario
