OFFICE OF THE CHANCELLOR

SACRAMENTAL RECORDS: The information contained in the Sacramental registers relating to individuals is highly privileged. Sharing it with third parties is a violation of their privacy in both canon and civil law. For this reason, intentionally or negligently turning over Sacramental records could result in substantial trouble in civil (State) law. Pastors and parish secretaries may only issue copies of baptismal certificates, marriage certificates, and other Sacramental records for the individuals involved (named in the records) and at their own request. Of course, parents and legal guardians may request the records on behalf of under-age minors. Sacramental records may never be released to third parties (such as genealogy researchers, etc.). The only exception is to turn them over to authorized Diocesan personnel periodically for copying. There are absolutely no other exceptions. Any request for viewing Sacramental records outside these parameters must be brought to the prior attention of Rev. Keith Weber, Chancellor. His email address is keith.weber@salinadiocese.org.

OFFICE OF LITURGY

WORLD DAY OF PRAYER: September 1, designated by Pope Francis as World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, falls on a Sunday this year. The U.S. Bishops' Committee on Divine Worship suggests some options for celebrating this.

1. Offering the Mass "For the Sanctification of Human Labor" from the Masses and Prayers for Various Needs and Occasions (no. 26; see especially the second Collect of formulary A) may be a fitting option. This is allowed to replace a Sunday in Ordinary Time.
2. Even if this Mass is chosen, green vestments should be worn.
3. Preface V of the Sundays in Ordinary Time, entitled "Creation," speaks of God's creation of the world and of the need of humanity to praise God by caring for that creation.
4. Probably the readings for the Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time should be proclaimed since they are already printed in worship materials. However, some or all of the readings could be replaced by others from the appropriate selection in volume IV of the *Lectionary for Mass* (see Mass "For the Blessing of Human Labor," nos. 907-911). The use of Genesis 2:4b-9, 15 and Psalm 90:2, 3-5a, 12-13, 14 and 16 (see nos. 907-2 and 909, respectively) could be noteworthy substitutions for the First Reading and Responsorial Psalm, while retaining the other readings of the Sunday.
5. Note that these are suggestions, not a mandate. Even if none of these choices are implemented, it would be appropriate to mention the care of the earth in the homily, the general intercessions, or after Communion.

OFFICE OF YOUTH MINISTRY

PRAYER AND ACTION: We've had a wonderful summer in Colby and Abilene with our youth and college students. I would like to thank Father Richard Daise and the Sacred Heart Parish in Colby, and Father Don Zimmerman and St. Andrew's Parish for allowing us to come to your towns and the use of your parish facilities. We know it disrupts the parish but it's a wonderful experience for our youth and their adult leaders. Thank you! Thank you!

If any parish would like to host Prayer and Action next summer please let me know as soon as possible. We pick a parish in the western part of our diocese as well as an eastern part of the diocese. When hosting this program I always hear comments that the parish community, as well as the people in these towns are touched to see young people giving of themselves in painting, yard work, painting houses etc. We don't have to go out of our diocese for a mission trip we have that available right here in our own diocese. I believe we had close to 500 young people and adult sponsors participate in this program this summer.

NCYC (National Catholic Youth Conference): We are still in need of the second payment and the paperwork from some of our parishes. Please check with your adult leaders if they have sent this into the office.

The third payment is due SEPTEMBER 12, 2019. We will have close to 1000 kids and adults attending NCYC November 19-23. Thank you for supporting your youth as they raise the money for this trip. It truly has been a life changing event for some of our youth that have attended in the past years.

The proverbial return of “back to school” naturally turns our attention to the value of education. However, education is not solely or even primarily the task of our local school district or catholic school. The family has been given the title of the “first school” and refers to parents as the “first educators.” Parents bear witness to this responsibility first by creating a home where tenderness, forgiveness, respect, fidelity, and disinterested service are the rule.” Thus, they create a home well suited for education in the virtues” (CCC 2223). They have the privilege of evangelizing their children and should educate them in the faith from the children’s “earliest years” (CCC 2225-2226).

What are we doing as parents in our own homes to really fulfill the role as first educators of our children?

Eat dinner together as a family

We rarely think about it, but sharing a meal is one of the most intimate and relational acts. The beginning of a new school year is one of the busiest times of the year. Sports practices, band practice, debate club, and all sorts of extracurricular activities compete with family time and the bonds we may have formed throughout summer vacations and camping. However, sharing a meal can be a powerful unifying force. At meal time, kids can learn social skills and the essential skill of conversation. Conversation is a truly human skill which is being lost. Many students are unable to form relationships because they have lost the art of engaging in conversation. Many will not make eye contact, cannot carry on a conversation, and are lost without their phones. They are highly connected but quite lonely.

Attend Mass on Saturdays/Sundays as a family

School brings a lot of competition for time. Sports and other events quickly fill our weekends. Make Mass a priority. There is no greater investment that you can make in your child’s faith than to keep the Sabbath holy, no matter your schedule.

Pray together as a family daily or weekly

Pope Francis has consistently reiterated the necessity of a strong family for both the individual and society. One key to family unity is prayer. Prayer in the home does not have to be complex. In fact, Pope Francis teaches that “...we need simplicity to pray as a family: simplicity is necessary! Praying the Our Father together, around the table, is not something extraordinary: it’s easy. Praying the Rosary together as a family is very beautiful and a source of great strength! It is also important to pray for one another! The husband for his wife, the wife for her husband, both together for their children, the children for their grandparents....praying for each other. This is what it means to pray in the family and it is what makes the family strong: prayer.”

Make sure your child is enrolled in your Parish Religious Education

While you are enrolling in all those other extracurricular activities, don’t forget about religious education. Be sure you are preparing your children to receive the sacramental preparation, whether it be First Communion, First Reconciliation, or Confirmation.

Attend Parish Faith Formation events

Check out your parish’s events and offerings to determine how you and your children can deepen your faith and learn about God. We cannot give what we do not have.

Ask Father!

When your children ask hard questions to you about God, encourage them to ask your parish priest to get the answers. This is another great way to help kids learn how to converse. It is also a great way to get to know your priest.

Religious books and non-religious books

Encourage your children to read religious books and non-religious books this school year. One suggestion for a religious book for teens is *Made For More* by Curtis Martin. It is a simple explanation of the faith which is highly engaging and intellectually formative. This mixing and matching of books helps integrate faith in a natural way into family life and helps to keep faith from being just something families do on Sundays.

We pray these suggestions will help you and your family grow in faith this school year!
