## **OFFICE OF THE CHANCELLOR**

**SACRAMENTAL RECORDS:** The information contained in the Sacramental registers relating to individuals is highly privileged. Sharing it with third parties is a violation of their privacy in both canon and civil law. For this reason, intentionally or negligently turning over Sacramental records could result in substantial trouble in civil (State) law.

Pastors and parish secretaries may only issue copies of baptismal certificates, marriage certificates, and other Sacramental records for the individuals involved (named in the records) and at their own request. Of course, parents and legal guardians may request the records on behalf of under-age minors. Sacramental records may never be released to third parties (such as genealogy researchers, etc.). The only exception is to turn them over to authorized Diocesan personnel periodically for copying. There are absolutely no other exceptions. Any request for viewing Sacramental records outside these parameters must be brought to the attention of Pamela Sullivan, Chancellor and Diocesan Attorney. ## OFFICE OF SAFETY AND SECURITY

- ✝ Dates for on-site visits to Parishes and Schools (Year 1, Western Vicariate and Manhattan and Junction City) have been set. Wendy Backes will be contacting the Safety Coordinator of each parish and/or school with **your** scheduled date and time, along with a tentative agenda.
- ✝ Safety Coordinators: **Please review your spreadsheet and make sure it is up to date.** If you still have new volunteers who need safe environment training (VIRTUS/ESR) those need to be taken care of ASAP. If you still have someone with their latest background checks being in 2011 those people need updating ASAP.
- ✝ Safe Environment training for **STUDENTS** (Child Lures etc...). This training should be completed in the first semester of school. Please be sure to return your signed Testimony of Compliance Form to Wendy Backes at the Diocese by **January 1, 2017.**
- ✝ All parishes are reminded to place the “Abuse of Minors Pastoral Response Hotline” announcement **quarterly** in their Parish bulletins.
- ✝ A couple of quick reminders: please have your volunteers, employees and educators **PRINT** the VIRTUS instructions when directing them to do the training.

### *The training includes:*

1. Registering with VIRTUS
2. Completing the ESR background check
3. Watching the VIRTUS video.

Please be sure to tell your volunteers, employees and educators to allow 2 hours to complete this training, and the complete training needs to be completed in one session.

Please follow up with those doing the training to make sure they have completed all **three** parts.

A VIRTUS **certificate** is a certificate that shows completion of the VIRTUS **video**.

The certificate is **not** a record of a completed **ESR** background check.

- ✝ The Safe Environment program has policies and procedures and requirements that need to be followed. Please be mindful of those as our safe environment programs are in place to assist parents and children—and those who work with children in securing a safe environment for our young people where they can grow to full and human Christian maturity.

## CREATIVE CHRISTMAS GIFTS FOR FAMILIES

The great gift of Christmas is Jesus Christ. Every year Christians celebrate *EMMANUEL*, "God-is-with-us," through sacred liturgy and family tradition. Here are some ways to keep the Christmas spirit of giving to others without giving in to commercialism.

### Give of Yourself

Christmas is a celebration of God's gift of self in Jesus. This season, give of yourself by giving presents of your time and talent to others. Make "coupons" or "gift" certificates for services like teaching a child to knit or taking an older friend out for coffee once a month. Be creative in making gift certificates on parchment paper or on 3x5 cards decorated with stickers, markers or painted designs. Here are some family-tested coupon gift ideas:

- ☺ For the Coach: three Wednesday night dinners (practice night) delivered to your door
- ☺ For teachers: 2 hours of baby-sitting or help with yard work
- ☺ For sibling: a coupon for room cleaning or chore trade
- ☺ For Mom/Dad: 3 or 4 "personal touch" car washes (inside and out) when they're needed most
- ☺ For homebound friends: a monthly "ride pass" for errands or other events; call in advance to set date
- ☺ For older friends: 3 hours of "manual labor" (raking, hauling, moving), available upon request
- ☺ For anyone:
  - a trip together to \_\_\_\_\_ (name of their favorite place)
  - or a visit to the apple farm together next fall
  - or use imagination instead of charge cards . . . it works!

### Give the Hope, Joy and Peace of Christmas

The hopeful messages of Christmas are often muffled by the sounds of commerce and the hectic pace of busy families. Give to others what God gives to us this season: peace, hope, and light in darkness, affirmation of human dignity and joy. Here are some ways to do that:



#### Peace:

- 1. Say "I'm sorry" or "let's be friends again" to an estranged friend or relative.
- 2. Promise to turn down the volume on stereos in cars or rooms at home.
- 3. Gift yourself and someone you love with a book or magazine article about communication and conflict resolution. Give yourselves time to digest new information and talk about it together.
- 4. Write your congressman about military spending.



#### Hope/Light in darkness:

- 1. During Advent, eat the family meal or observe some other time together in darkness. On December 25 and each night till Epiphany, eat by candlelight only.
- 2. Write a note of encouragement or call a friend who struggles with depression.
- 3. During Advent or Christmas time, find a church or community project that addresses a seemingly hopeless situation and contribute to it in time and money as a family.
- 4. Smile or say a word of encouragement to two people each day. Remind yourself on the calendar. By Epiphany it may become a habit.



#### Affirm Human Dignity:

- 1. For the 12 days of Christmas, each day name one fine quality or gift of each family member. Draw a simple portrait of all family members and pencil in the affirming remark under each person's picture each day.
- 2. Support your local community's effort to protect the life of the unborn.
- 3. Call a moratorium on name-calling at home during Christmas time. Violations can be made up with a kiss, a quarter, or a favor.
- 4. Visit a homeless shelter as a family and spend time playing with or just talking with residents.



#### Joy:

- 1. Start the season by listing all the gifts your family already has—like good health, friends, singing ability, etc. Give thanks to God for them. Write them on a brightly wrapped box and place it under the tree. Consciously make efforts to share those gifts with others this season.
- 2. Fill your heart and home with Christmas music that proclaims the joyful themes of the season. Play it everyday as background music at home and in the car. Choose your favorite and let the hosanna's take over!
- 3. Do good for others as a family to bring joy into your home. Decorate an infirm neighbor's tree, take into your home a single parent friend's children for 24 hours, or serve a meal at the soup kitchen. Do whatever kind deed fits your household, Joy is the sure reward!
- 4. Go caroling with friends—non-singers can play the kazoo, ring bells, or smile and hold the music for others.

### **Christmas Log**

Christmas night or sometime before the tree comes down, ask each family member to write his or her impressions of this Christmas—gifts given and received, special moments with relatives and friends, etc. Put these ideas in a homemade Christmas log (decorated notebook or scrapbook) and add to it each year. Store the log with Christmas decorations and take it out each year to remember the past and celebrate the present. Don't be picky about neatness or consistency. Write out comments of preschoolers. Include entries by special visitors who stay at your home each holiday.

### **Ornament Collection**

Purchase or make a new ornament each year for each child. Choose a symbol that celebrates some special event, accomplishment, trip, award, etc. Print your name and date on the top and bottom of each ornament. When children grow up and move away, they can take years of memories with them.

**P.S.** This is also a good godparent gift to a godchild. Make sure your name and date are taped to each ornament.

### **Celebrate the Story**

Celebrate the story and themes of Christmas time. Read aloud, watch TV specials together, attend a play or concerts where Christ's coming, generous giving, or changes of heart and peacemaking are major themes. Add a Christmas book each year to the family collection of good Christmas literature. Play Christmas music around the house that celebrates the sacred themes of the season.

### **Daily Stress Reducers**

Give your family time to reflect on the meaning of the season and counteract the frantic pace of Christmas activities. Try a warm bath at night, call an old friend and visit for 15 minutes, or bundle up and take a walk in a winter snowfall—breathe in the beauty.

### **Give Up a "Have To"**

Give up a "have to" this season. Call instead of sending Christmas cards within the city and send out of town greetings at New Year's, Epiphany, or even Valentine's Day! Then you can respond to news received at Christmas. Pay (or trade services) a friend or neighbor to do your baking.



Give the job to someone who may need to earn a little extra money. Give everyone the same gifts this year, like red flannel nightshirts, nativity sets, or a set of screwdrivers. Personalize each gift with stick or sew-on labels. Say “no” to the extraneous parties/gatherings you feel obliged to attend. Attend one or two each week and politely decline others. You can say you have a conflict with other plans (like staying at home with your feet up).

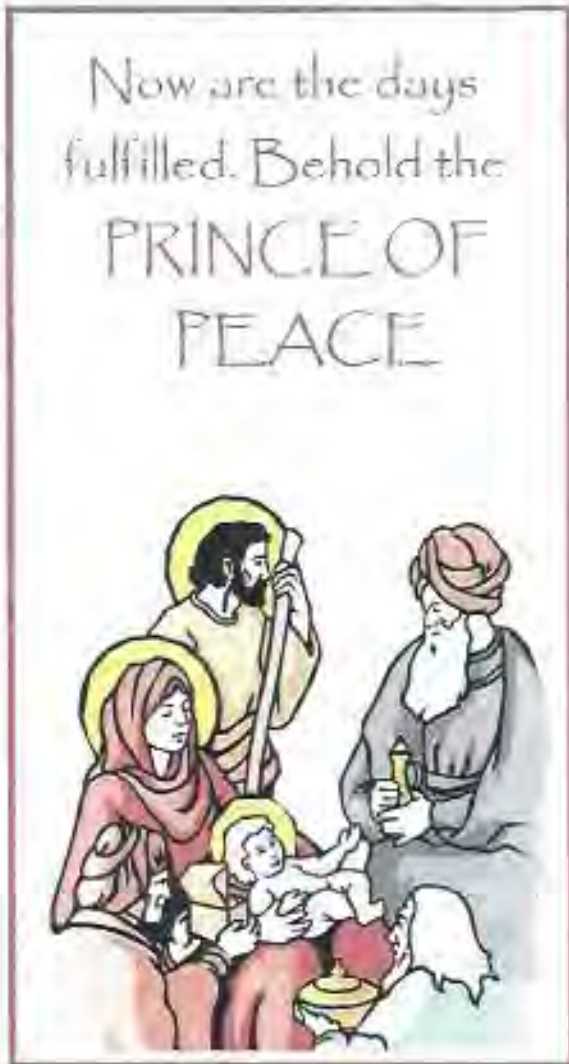
#### **Open Heart and Home at Christmas**

Invite a stranger (one who is alone, poor or outcast) to your home or take a meal and spend time with persons who have few friends with whom to celebrate. Reconcile a disagreement with a co-worker or relative and celebrate with a gift of Christmas goodies. Help with a food or clothing drive, deliver meals to shut-ins, adopt an unemployed or refugee family and gift them in some appropriate way. (They may need postage stamps or a new battery for their car—find out first.)

#### **Celebrate Christmas Past**

Designate an evening during the season for showing old movies and/or pictures and telling stories of family Christmas celebrations and events such as the snowstorms, gift mix-ups or unexpected company. Invite grandparents or older friends to reminisce with you! Write down or record the storytelling for future generations.

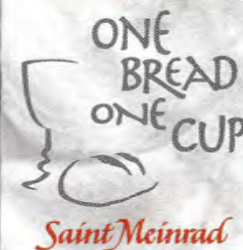
