EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT PLAN: The resent devastating church shootings in Texas have raised awareness about the need for basic safety and security measures for our parishes and to take precautions in protecting against such violent attacks. If your parish has not looked into assessing security measures it is imperative you do so as soon as possible.

In an effort to provide more detailed assistance with preparing and responding to active shooter situations Catholic Mutual has completed excellent guidelines, procedures, and recommendations (please see below). Catholic Mutual's Emergency Procedure resources can be found on their website <u>www.catholicmutual.org</u>

* Pastors and other members of safety committees at the parishes are encouraged to watch Catholic Mutual's Defeating a Violent Intruder series on CMGConnect. A second video will provide assistance in creating an Emergency Response Plan which is something all parishes should develop as soon as possible.

* Guidance regarding written Emergency Procedures for Ushers and an Active Shooter Emergency Response is available to parishes to use as a template when drafting a plan of your own.

* Parishes are encouraged to utilize the free Emergency Procedures App that was recently made available for electronic devices such as cell phones or tablets. Instructions to download the app in both English and Spanish found on the CARES materials on Catholic Mutual's website addressing security. This information should be able to assist parish members on recommendations to provide better security for parishes.

You may contact the Emergency Management representative that is in your county and they will make themselves available to assist you in constructing an Emergency Procedure Plan specifically for your parish at no cost to you. OFFICE OF LITURGY

I'm sure you have all figured out your Mass schedules for December 24-25. People will probably be asking you if they can attend Mass on Sunday evening and have it count for their obligation for both Sunday and Christmas. The answer is no.

The same goes for December 31. If you are providing an evening Mass for the Holy Day, people cannot participate in that Mass and count it for both December 31, Sunday, Holy Family and January 1, Monday, Mary, Mother of God.

Documentation below was provided by Msgr. Brinkman, if you care to read it.

The reasoning:

There no two obligations intersecting one another. According to canon 1247 the obligation to participate in Mass is tied to Sunday or a holy day of obligation that begins at midnight. Consequently, the obligation itself is binding not from 4:00pm on the evening preceding the Sunday or holy day of obligation but only during the midnight-to-midnight period of the day of precept itself (cc. 200 and 202 §1). In other words, on Sunday evening December 24 the faithful are able to fulfill their obligation for Christmas, but they are not required to do so. When commenting on *Orientalium Ecclesiarum* 15 that extended the *tempus utile* for Eastern Catholics to satisfy their Mass obligation in the evening before, Victor J. Pospishil made a similar argument that "should he, e.g., foresee that he will be prevented from attending church on the Sunday or holyday, he is not obliged to assist at Mass on the preceding evening although he has such possibility."[i]

Therefore, the code only offers a possibility to satisfy a Mass obligation in the evening before, but it does not extend the obligation to the evening before. Otherwise, the precept of Sunday rest would be binding already in Saturday evening as well. Accordingly, while on the surface it seems that two Mass attendance obligations are equal when they intersect in an evening, in reality they do not have the same weight. In such an evening there is only one binding obligation that takes precedence over the other.

In regard to USCCB: Actually, they gave direction (NCCB back then) for this matter in the early 70s. On July 24, 1970 Msgr. Giulio Einaudi, charge d'affairs of the Apostolic Delegation in the United States, wrote the following to Bishop Joseph Bernardin, general secretary of the NCCB:

"In reply to inquiries it continues to receive, the Sacred Congregation for the Clergy has again written to clarify the matter of fulfilling the double precept of the obligation to attend Mass.

The following dubium is presented: Whether the faithful who attend Mass on Saturday, 15 August, would fulfill the double precept of hearing Mass on Saturday, feast of the Assumption, and Sunday, 16 August?

In analogous cases, the Sacred Congregation, after deep study and due consideration gave the following response: Negative. His Holiness has approved this response.

The indult by which the faculty is given to fulfill the obligation of attending Mass on the evening of a Saturday or of a feast day of obligation is generally granted in view of rendering easier the fulfillment of such a precept, without prejudice of keeping every Lord's Day holy.

May I ask Your Excellency to bring this reply to the attention of the Most Reverend Ordinaries."[ii]

This letter references not just the congregation's reply to the *dubium* but also (at least) one more answer given by the same congregation to someone else, which can indicate that the matter of concurring Mass obligations was discussed and considered a resolved matter. As Brian Dunn points out, although it was not an authentic interpretation of the law, being only a private reply, it does indicate the *praxis Curiae*.[iii]Moreover, the indication that the Roman pontiff has approved the resolution of the *dubium* can give greater weight to this praxis. This letter was made known to the wider public in the United States only in November of 1974 in the *Newsletter* of the Bishops' Committee on the Liturgy.[iv]

OFFICE OF MARRIAGE TRIBUNAL

After 25 years of priestly ordination the diocese permits a priest to apply for a sabbatical of up to three months. Several months ago, with the Bishop's permission, I applied for a 12 week sabbatical at the Institute for Continuing Theological Education at the Pontifical North American College in Rome. I was accepted into the program for the Spring 2018 session; They accept 30 priests every Spring. I will be departing for Rome on January 10th and returning to the Diocese after Easter.

During my sabbatical, Fr. Don Zimmerman will be serving as the acting pastor of the Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish in Hays. I am very grateful to the Diocese and Bishop Weisenburger for this opportunity. I am also thankful Fr. Don Zimmerman and his willingness to substitute for me while I am away from the parish. Tribunal operations will go on as usual with Fr. Peter O'Donnell and Mr. Corey Lyon processing cases along with Sr. Carolyn Juenemann, CSJ, coordinating Tribunal operations.

As a family, be watchful and look for symbols of the season. Lights, stars, candles, bells, wreaths, holly, nativity scenes and candy canes. These familiar symbols of *Advent* and Christmas are tangible ways for us to embrace, learn and anticipate our spiritual journey as we prepare for Christmas. Let us prepare Him room in our hearts, in our church and in our families as we journey through this *Advent* season.

Saint Nicholas and Gour Shoes! A St. Nicholas Day Tradition

Children's Prayer to St. Nicholas God Our Father we pray, That through the intercession of St. Nicholas. You will protect our children. Keep them safe from harm, And help them grow, And become worthy of Your sight. Give them strength, To keep their Faith in You, And to keep alive their joy, In Your creation. Through Jesus Christ Our Lord. Amen.



December 6th is the feast day of Saint Nicholas, the patron saint of Children, which appropriately falls during the Advent season. One of the old Christian traditions surrounding his feast day was for kids to leave their shoes out overnight in front

of the fireplace on the windowsill, or outside their bedroom door so that St. Nicholas could fill them with special fruits, candies and other small gifts and treats. While Catholics in America aren't

as big on celebrating this feast day with their children, more and more American Catholic families are adopting St. Nicholas Day as a special Advent family tradition. Continue this Advent

tradition with your family and teach your children to venerate the saints and deepen their knowledge of love for their Catholic Faith. Ideas to fill your children's shoes may be chocolate coins, a small toy, new socks, an orange, rosary and a prayer card.

Make a Mary Candle

You will need a large white pillar candle. Decorate it with symbols of Christ, such as *chi rho* (the first two letters of Christ's name in Greek, it looks like a large letter P with an X across the bottom part of the stem). Place it in a special part of your home and cover it with a white cloth or lace for the remainder of Advent. The candle represents Christ, the white cloth represents Mary. On Christmas, remove the cloth to reveal Christ, and light the candle all through the Christmas season.



The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, December 8th, go to Mass as a family-and listen carefully. Make a Mary Candle, listen to music about Mary, pray a Marian Prayer (Hail Mary, Hail, Holy Queen, or the Magnificat).
