CONFIRMATION - SACRAMENTAL RECORDS: The new round of Confirmations is beginning this month. On the occasion of the celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation, please have the books containing the sacramental records of your parish available for my review. If several parish communities are together, please provide the records of each parish. Also all parishes are reminded to complete the form and mail it to the Bishop's Office at least seven working days prior to Confirmation. (See Section VI-7B of the Diocesan Handbook) or on the Diocesan Web site under the Bishop's Section, you will find the Confirmation Liturgy Plan – which is a fillable form for your convenience.) The completed Updated February 2016 form along with the letters from the Candidates should be mailed to my office at least seven working days prior to the date scheduled for Confirmation. A hard copy is also attached with this SDNB for your convenience. Please have a name tag/badge on the Confirmandi which easily shows the Confirmation name.



LENTEN SMALL GROUPS: Lent begins on Wednesday, March 1, 2017. Parishes are encouraged to form small faith-sharing groups. Once again, the choice of materials is left to the discretion of the parish. The Diocese encourages the use of materials from *Disciples on the Journey*. Most materials are included in each participant's booklet, and some optional, additional materials for youth and families are available for free online. This year's booklets also include some brief discussion/reflection material based on Pope Francis' encyclical *Laudato Si (On Care for our Common Home)*. NECROLOGY UPDATE

The 2016 update for the Necrology is complete. The update includes the addition of Fr. Larry Pierce and several index pages. Active priests should have picked their copies up at the Clergy Renewal Days in January. For those who were unable to make it, and for retired priests, the copies have been mailed to you. Please be sure to insert the new pages and toss the old pages.

As a reminder about the Necrology, there should be a copy in every sacristy in the diocese. If your sacristy does NOT have a copy, please contact Karen at (785) 827-8746 x21 or karen.bonar@salinadiocese.org. Additionally, many rectories should have a copy of the Necrology. Some rectories that are unoccupied will not have a copy. If there is not a copy in your rectory or sacristy, please let me know! I have a list for which locations should have a copy of the Necrology.

The only clergy with a personal copy of the Necrology are the Bishop and retired priests. Otherwise, the copy remains at the sacristy/rectory and will stay put, even if you are reassigned. If a Necrology copy made its way into your personal boxes during a move and you have an extra copy, please let me know and we can try to find its original home.

Salina, Sacred Heart Cathedral March 12, 3:00 p.m.

(NOTE: Daylight Savings Time begins today)

- Please send in the names and addresses and specify if they are <u>Candidates</u> or <u>Catechumens</u> (please use only these Titles). Please be sure the spellings are correct. Submit the information to the Liturgy Office at the Chancery or you may email Julie Bilson at <u>julie.bilson@salinadiocese.org</u>.
- Please **respond no later** than Tuesday, February 28, for Hays and Tuesday, March 7, for Salina. Also indicate which location they will attend the Rite of Election.
- If a person is completing Confirmation Only, they do not go through the Rite of Election.
- If a youth is younger than age 7 the youth does <u>not</u> go through the Rite of Election.
- Please note on your list if any people are related and what that relationship is.
- The Bishop will send a personal letter of invitation to each Candidate and Catechumen. The letter is available in English and Spanish. Please indicate if you want the letter sent in Spanish (or Spanish and English) to any individuals.
- Thank you for sending the above information which will help the Liturgy Office plan these celebrations.

1. REMINDERS THAT MAY HELP as you prepare for the Rite of Election.

On the morning of the first Sunday of Lent, the parish should celebrate the PARISH CELEBRATION FOR SENDING CATECHUMENS FOR ELECTION AND CANDIDATES FOR RECOGNITION BY THE BISHOP, nos. 530-546 in the RCIA Ritual. Catechumens should sign the Book of Elect during that rite (see no. 539). Parishes whose Rite of Election is celebrated on the Second Sunday of Lent should celebrate the Rite of Sending on that day.

Bring your Book of Elect to the Diocesan Rite of Election. The names of the Elect will be read from this book and presented to the Bishop.

Instructions for the Rite:

A. The people in the procession are:

Catechumens and Candidates

Sponsors

RCIA Directors

Pastors

They should gather in the parish hall.

Family members and guests are not in the procession. They should go to the church before the ceremony begins.

OFFICE OF LITURGY (cont.)

- B. The front pews are reserved for the people in the procession.
- C. Catechumens/Candidates should sit on the left side of the church; Sponsors, Directors and Pastors should sit on the right side of the church. Please try to arrange the Catechumens and Candidates in the order that they will be called by the RCIA Director so that the procession will flow smoothly.
- D. The RCIA Director comes to the ambo when the name of the parish is called. S/he calls out the names in this way:
 - "I present for baptism...(all those names)
 - "I present for full communion...(all those names)

The Catechumens and Candidates come to the front as the names are being called. They should all leave the pew immediately, not waiting for their names to be called (think liturgical procession rather than graduation ceremony). The Bishop will greet each one individually, after which they return to their seats. When the Director finishes reading the names, s/he gives the Book of Elect to the Bishop, who signs it.

- 2. The Chrism Mass is at Sacred Heart Cathedral, Thursday, April 6, at 11:30 a.m.
- **3.** The Easter Vigil on April 15 should be celebrated no earlier than 8:30 p.m., since it will not be dark before then.

Optional Rice Bowl Blessing on Ash Wednesday

(suggested use: at announcement time just before the final blessing at Ash Wednesday Mass)

Presider:

This Lent, our parish will be participating in Catholic Relief Services (CRS) Operation Rice Bowl. It is a faith-in-action program that can help each of us experience our Catholic faith in a new way, by living in solidarity with the world's most poor and vulnerable. We hope that you and your family will take advantage of this opportunity to learn about the challenges facing many of our poorest brothers and sisters, and to deepen your own faith.

Included in your Rice Bowl is a Lenten calendar where you will find daily activities and prayers. There are Stories of Hope from people whose lives are better because of our support. There are also ideas for simple, meatless meals from around the world that you can prepare as a family each Friday.

The Rice Bowl itself holds the contributions families make during Lent. Seventy-five percent of donations to your Rice Bowl go to Catholic Relief Services' programs serving the poorest of the poor overseas; twenty-five percent goes toward diocesan projects that minister to those who are poor and vulnerable in our own communities.

As we look ahead to the coming days of Lent, may our fasting be a hunger for justice. May our alms be a making of peace. May our prayer be for the change of humble and grateful hearts. We ask that God put our faith into action, to work in love, to persevere in hope.

Loving God, You are blessed and the source of every blessing. Bless us now and as we use these Rice Bowls in prayer, fasting, and almsgiving this Lent. May they be an instrument of your love, and a reminder to us of your great desire for peace and justice. May they help us deepen our own faith in you and our love for one another, as we await with joyful anticipation the great celebration of Easter. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

Sacred Heart Cathedral is proud to announce that we will be the first stop on the St. Jude Pilgrimage of Hope in Kansas starting February 19th at 7PM. We will host the Ministries of Dominican Shrine of St. Jude Thaddeus in Chicago for an evening of prayer and blessings focusing on the Hope inspired St. Jude, the patron saint of desperate and seemingly hopeless situations.

Fr. Mike Ford, O.P., the director of the Shrine, will lead us as we explore what Hope is, how it can help us in today's complicated world, and give those who attend an opportunity to receive a special blessing with Oil of St. Jude. St. Jude oil will also be available after the event.

Edith Prendergast, R.S.C. was born Catherine (Kathleen) Predergast in Moneyvroe, Cappoquin, Co. Waterford, to Catherine and Richard Prendergast. She was the fifth of six children to be raised on the family farm in the townland of Affane in the western area of the county. It was in this rural setting that Edith learned that care for those less fortunate was a basic human value that defines who we are in the world before one another and before God. Her father, Richard, was a man who often invited travelers neighbors, strangers and friends, to join the family at table for a meal. Need was met with Richard's quiet graciousness, and this ever-present generosity toward those less fortunate shaped Edith as she eventually grew to discern a vocation to religious life. Edith's primary-level education took place at St. John the Baptist primary school in Affane, from which she graduated and entered secondary school at the Presentation Convent School in Lismore, Waterford. Following her graduation from Secondary School (High School), she sat for state examinations in which successfully secured employment as a civil servant in the governmental Department of Agriculture. Within a year, however, the strong faith environment and outreach to the needy experienced in her family setting, inspired her to dedicate herself to religious life. Inspired by the story and example of Mother Mary Aikenhead. Edith pursued this vocation with the Religious Sisters of Charity at Milltown, Dublin, entering the convent on February 2, 1959. It was as a novice that the young woman born to Richard and Catherine chose the name Edith in religious life.
