CATHOLIC SCHOOL STUDENT SUBSIDY: The per student subsidy for the 2018-2019 school year will increase to \$85.00 per student. The subsidy is based on the allocation from the Catholic Community Annual Appeal, donations received, and earnings on investments.

PARISH CHECKING ACCOUNTS: Just a reminder that all checking accounts using the parish ID number should have the pastor/PLC listed as one of the signers on the account. Also the group who is managing the account (i.e. CYO, Ladies Group, Religious Ed) should to the best of their ability follow the Parish Accounts and Financial Control Guidelines as listed in the Diocesan Policies and Risk Management (red) binder (page 55 of the Parish Risk Management section).

THE COMPENSATION FOR CLERGY PAGE for your Diocesan Handbook has been updated with the new rate for Extra Mileage Reimbursement. Please insert the attached page into your handbook under the Priests section (Section X, pages 61 and 62).

SECOND HALF OF PARISH TAX is now due. Please check the enclosed sheet (blue) to see what amount, if any, is due from your parish(es). Also, please check the total amount due for your parish(es) as amounts may have changed due to Annual Reports received late. Send check to the chancery **Attn:** FINANCE OFFICE.

OFFICE OF LITURGY

1. **REMINDERS THAT MAY HELP** as you prepare for the Rite of Election.

On the morning of the first Sunday of Lent, the parish should celebrate the PARISH CELEBRATION FOR SENDING CATECHUMENS FOR ELECTION AND CANDIDATES FOR RECOGNITION BY THE BISHOP, nos. 530-546 in the RCIA Ritual. Catechumens should sign the Book of Elect during that rite (see no. 539). Parishes whose Rite of Election is celebrated on the Second Sunday of Lent should celebrate the Rite of Sending on that day.

Bring your Book of Elect to the Diocesan Rite of Election. The names of the Elect will be read from this book and presented to the Diocesan Administrator.

Instructions for the Rite:

A. The people in the procession are:

Catechumens and Candidates

Sponsors

RCIA Directors

Pastors

They should gather in the parish hall.

Family members and guests are not in the procession. They should go to the church before the ceremony begins.

OFFICE OF LITURGY (cont.)

- B. The front pews are reserved for the people in the procession.
- C. Catechumens/Candidates should sit on the left side of the church; Sponsors, Directors, and Pastors should sit on the right side of the church. Please try to arrange the Catechumens and Candidates in the order that they will be called by the RCIA Director so that the procession will flow smoothly.
- D. The RCIA Director comes to the ambo when the name of the parish is called. S/he calls out the names in this way:
 - "I present for baptism...(all those names)
 - "I present for full communion...(all those names)

The Catechumens and Candidates come to the front as the names are being called. They should all leave the pew immediately, not waiting for their names to be called (think liturgical procession rather than graduation ceremony). The Diocesan Administrator will greet each one individually, after which they return to their seats. When the Director finishes reading the names, s/he gives the Book of Elect to the Diocesan Administrator, who signs it.

- **2.** The Chrism Mass is at Sacred Heart Cathedral, Thursday, March 22, at 11:30 a.m.
 - **2.** The Easter Vigil on March 31 should be celebrated no earlier than 8:30 p.m., since it will not be dark before then.



We appreciate your cooperation as you continue to update and review your volunteers, employees and educators in the CMGConnect data base. If there are still individuals who need training, please have them get that done as soon as possible. This is very important, as the Diocese will be having an on-site audit this year, and we need your cooperation in the field to make sure our numbers in CMGConnect are as accurate as possible!

As we continue our mission *Promise to Protect, Pledge to Heal*, it is important that we here at the Diocese are persistent in learning more about Child Sexual Abuse and communicating that information to those of you who work in the field.

On Wednesday, January 24th, Corey and Wendy attended a workshop in Salina called, *Child Sexual Abuse: Our Response Matters.* The Keynote speakers were Jenna Quinn (a triumphant survivor of sexual abuse, author, speaker and the survivor behind Jenna's Law) and her mother Kellie, who, like many mothers, did not recognize the signs her daughter was exhibiting during this dark period of her teenage years. Jenna has been an activist for the past 12 years, sharing her unique and inspiring story with legislatures, law enforcement, abuse-prevention groups, schools, churches and the general public. She has dedicated her life to preventing child sexual abuse through education and legislation. proof that there really are saints from A to Z!

It's February, but wait, didn't we just celebrate New Year's?

The month itself is "short", it normally only has 28 days, but, for some reason the month can drag on forever.

February can be snowy and dark and with not much to do. Thankfully, the church calendar is full of liturgical celebrations and feast days that we can participate in. Observing holy days and feast days are very beneficial. They call us back to the "important" things in life. As we celebrate these days, we take time to pray, to be inspired by the saints and grow together spiritually as a family.

February 2- The Presentation of the Lord- Candlemas

This feast recognizes the day that Mary and Joseph take Jesus to the temple. It was traditional Jewish law that baby boys were presented at the temple 40 days after their birth. The Presentation also was a time when the church would bless candles for people to use in their homes. When you go to mass, bring a candle, consider having it blessed this day and use it in your home for special occasions.



February 3 - Feast of St. Blaise

St. Blaise was a physician who cured, even performing miraculous cures, so those who were sick, invoked his intercessions. Eventually, the custom of the blessing of throats arose, whereby the priest held two crossed candles over the heads of the faithful or touched their throats with them while he invoked the prayer of the saint and imparted God's blessing. This practice continues today in many parishes on St. Blaise's feast day. Have you or anyone in your family had their throats blessed?

"Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from every disease of the throat and from every other illness, in the name of the Father, and of the Son. and of the Holy Spirit."

February 13- Mardi Gras, Fat Tuesday or Shrove Tuesday Always celebrated the day before Ash Wednesday.

The official colors are gold, purple and green. Gold represents power; purple, justice; and green faith.

Traditionally, pancakes were eaten in abundance on Fat Tuesday so that the kitchens could be cleared of all butter, eggs, and milk since these were not eaten during Lent. "Pancakes" have become so important on this day, that many cities even hold pancake races.

Yet, another tradition, the King Cake, with the hidden plastic baby inside. The finder of the baby in their piece of cake is King for the rest of the day. A favorite tradition across Polish communities, eating Paczki, a dense yet puffy fruit-filled doughnut.

February 14-March 29- Lent

Lent last for 40 days. Its purpose is to call us back to Christ, bring us closer to our Lord, especially in response to his love for us shown in his suffering, death, and resurrection. The church has given us some traditional practices to help us to do that.

P -Prayer: Stations of the Cross, Mass, Confession, Adoration

Α -Almsgiving: "Rice Bowl" - crsricebowl.org

U -Useful service and acts of charity: help at food bank, soup kitchen, or nursing home

S -Self-sacrifices: give up something that benefits others and become acts of charity

E -Educating ourselves: Study scripture, learn devotions, watch a good Catholic

These are the start of simple and meaningful Lent ideas that you can do with your family. Choose what you feel would work best, or try to come up with your own ideas. Why not make it a family tradition?

February 14-Ash Wednesday

We begin lent, with Ash Wednesday, one of the most popular and important holy days in the liturgical calendar. The practice includes the wearing of ashes on the forehead. The ashes do not announce holiness to others, but rather, sinfulness from which we must repent. Adults and children alike are asked questions from non-Catholics on this day, some are too embarrassed to answer the questions. Here is a list of questions and answers that may help to explain this Catholic practice to our non-Catholic friends.

Q: Hey, your forehead's dirty. What's that on your forehead?

A: Ashes...they're from church.

Q: Why did your church put dirt on your forehead?

A: It's not dirt; they're ashes. Today's Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent. Catholics wear ashes to show that we want to change to get ready for Easter.

Q: Are they supposed to be in a shape or something? Just looks like a smudge to me.

A: It's supposed to be in the shape of a cross - like the one that Jesus

0: So you think you're something special because you're wearing ashes on your forehead?

A: No, just the opposite. It shows that without God, this is all we are ashes. It's a way of admitting how much we need God.

0: So how're you gonna change...gonna become all holy on us?

A: Just trying to become what God wants me to be...a good person.

Q: I hear you guys give up stuff for Lent too. What for?

A: Giving up stuff - like snacks or watching TV or swearing - is kinda like exercise - it's hard work but it makes us stronger.

Q: So you can't have any fun for how long?

A: I can still have fun, I'm just gonna be doing some stuff a little differently for 40 days...that's how long until Easter.

Q: Then you can go back to being your old self?

A: No, that's the point, hopefully I'll be an even better version of myself!


