CHANGES TO BUILDINGS AND PROPERTY DURING 2018:

If a parish has made any changes to the buildings or property, no matter how large or small those changes may be, we ask that the parish fill out the annual Parish Physical Plant Improvement form (page V-13 in the Diocesan Handbook).

These forms are put in the parish file in the diocesan finance office for future pastors to determine when certain improvements were made to the parish buildings. Several pastors have requested the information on past forms and have found the information quite helpful. If you have any questions about these forms, please contact Kyle Haugh or Jennifer Hood.

CATHOLIC SCHOOL STUDENT SUBSIDY: The per student subsidy for the 2019-2020 school year will increase to \$90.00 per student. The subsidy is based on the allocation from the Bishop's Annual Appeal, donations received, and earnings on investments.

OFFICE OF LITURGY

1. REMINDERS THAT MAY HELP as you prepare for the Rite of Election.

On the morning of the first Sunday of Lent, the parish should celebrate the PARISH CELEBRATION FOR SENDING CATECHUMENS FOR ELECTION AND CANDIDATES FOR RECOGNITION BY THE BISHOP, nos. 530-546 in the RCIA Ritual. Catechumens should sign the Book of Elect during that rite (see no. 539). Parishes whose Rite of Election is celebrated on the Second Sunday of Lent should celebrate the Rite of Sending on that day.

Bring your Book of Elect to the Diocesan Rite of Election. The names of the Elect will be read from this book and presented to the Bishop.

Instructions for the Rite:

A. The people in the procession are:

Catechumens and Candidates

Sponsors

RCIA Directors

Pastors

They should gather in the parish hall.

Family members and guests are not in the procession. They should go to the church before the ceremony begins.

- B. The front pews are reserved for the people in the procession.
- C. Catechumens/Candidates should sit on the left side of the church; Sponsors, Directors and Pastors should sit on the right side of the church. Please try to arrange the Catechumens and Candidates in the order that they will be called by the RCIA Director so that the procession will flow smoothly.
- D. The RCIA Director comes to the ambo when the name of the parish is called. S/he calls out the names in this way:

"I present for baptism...(all those names)

"I present for full communion...(all those names)

The Catechumens and Candidates come to the front as the names are being called. They should all leave the pew immediately, not waiting for their names to be called (think liturgical procession rather than graduation ceremony). The Bishop will greet each one individually, after which they return to their seats. When the Director finishes reading the names, s/he gives the Book of Elect to the Bishop, who signs it.

- **2.** The Chrism Mass is at Sacred Heart Cathedral, Thursday, April 11, at 11:30 A.M.
- **3.** The Easter Vigil on April 20 should be celebrated no earlier than 8:30 P.M., since it will not be dark before then.

TESTIMONY OF COMPLIANCE FORM: A kind reminder to those who have not yet returned their form, please do so as soon as possible! Feel free to contact our office if you have any questions. This information is very important as we prepare for our audit this summer.

CERTIFICATION STATUS FORMS: If you have **not** turned in your form for Religious Education teachers and/or School teachers, coaches and support staff, please do so as soon as possible, as they need to be verified through our office.

All those who minister to children or young people are to be educated through the CMGConnect Training Program - a program that specializes in helping churches and religious organizations create safe environments for children and youth. This training program educates adults about the nature of child sexual abuse, how it is perpetrated, how to report it, and strategies for prevention.

ON SITE AUDIT VISITS TO PARISHES AND SCHOOLS: (West Central Deanery and St. Mary School-Ellis, Holy Family- Hays, TMP- Hays and Sacred Heart, Plainville) the schedule has been "finalized". If you have not heard from me or confirmed, please do so as soon as possible. The audit agenda and checklist will be sent out through email soon.

Mark your calendars and let everyone know that the Salina Diocese Catholic Rural Life Commission will be holding its **Winter Seminar** on March 2, 2019, at St Mary Queen of Angels in Russell, KS, beginning at 9:30 A.M. with Mass celebrated by Bishop Vincke. The Seminar will conclude after lunch. Each year the Rural Life Commission tries to bring information to our rural Diocese to help those involved in Agriculture find ways to grow in their faith and church teachings. This year, our Bishop will share his insights on these matters and who better than someone who grew up on a farm in Michigan? The cost will be \$10 per person with lunch served by the Russell CTO. Registration will be available through the Diocese Web site (www.salinadiocese.org/rural-life). We believe this will be an excellent opportunity for more people to get to meet and interact with Bishop Vincke during the seminar. We hope to see all of you on March 2nd.

ST. ISIDORE'S DAY will be observed on May 15, 2019, at Sacred Heart parish in Plainville, KS. Plan to join us for Mass, Blessing of the Fields and Flocks, lunch, and a tour of an agricultural activity in the area.

The 2019 RURAL LIFE DAY will be held in the West Deanery this year. It will be on Sunday afternoon, August 11, 2019. We will meet at St. Frances Cabrini parish in Hoxie, KS. Rural Life Day features the presenting of the Msgr. John George Weber Century Farm Awards for families owning or farming their farm for more than 100 years. Qualified families from anywhere in the Diocese may apply, but especially families in the West Deanery are encouraged to apply for the award. BISHOP'S ANNUAL APPEAL - CALL TO SHARE.

As many of you heard at the Priests Renewal Days, the Catholic Community Annual Appeal has been renamed the **Bishop's Annual Appeal**. Our theme is "Call to Share" along with the scripture verse **Behold, how good it is, and how pleasant, where humanity dwells as one,** from Psalm 133:1. This is an invitation to everyone in the diocese to learn more about our faith and how we work, and the opportunity to become more engaged in receiving/assisting with ministries, and our chance to positively impact the image and role of THE (entire) Catholic Church throughout the diocese. In short we are more than the sum of our parts.

OFFICE OF STEWARDSHIP & DEVELOPMENT (cont.)

This year's goal is \$1.4 million. As in years past, much of this annual appeal supports the ministries every parish uses. Almost half the funds, 49%, are used for seminarian education and the health care and retirement of clergy who in many cases have dedicated more than 50 years in service to the faithful of the Church. The next largest percentage, 37%, goes to ensure education and ministry support is provided. The smallest portion, only 10%, goes to support the general administrative and operations of the Chancery. More details are in the attached flyer.

The campaign this year will begin in February and will run through March into April. This is longer than in year's past. While, you will see many of the same elements, we are adding some new approaches to keep the message and information in front of Catholics and calling them to action. We want each family to have the time to take three steps with us:

- 1. **Listen and learn** what is the campaign and how does it impact me, my parish, and my local community
- 2. **Pray and discuss** with the information in hand, take time to pray individually and as a family about the role of the Church in their lives and of their responsibility in addressing current and future needs (as our parents and grandparents did for us)
- 3. **Decide and act** based on prayer and discussion each family can come to a decision of what they can do in 2019 and the terms of the gift. Finally, announce that gift by completing the pledge card and returning it.



A family is our first community and the most basic way in which the Lord gathers us, forms us and acts in the world. The basic vocation of every baptized person is the same: "Follow the way of *love*, even as Christ *loved* you." The Lord issues this call to your family and to every family regardless of its condition or circumstances.

"Make your house, your family, another Nazareth where love, peace, joy and unity reign for *love* begins at home." -Mother Theresa

WHAT IS THE VISION OF CATHOLIC FAMILY LIFE?

Should Catholic families be different from other families, and, if so, what does that look like?

Five "Marks" of the Catholic Family, by Dr. Gregory K. Popcak

- 1. Catholic Families Worship Together-The Eucharist is the source of the deep *love* and intimacy Catholic families are called to live out. To celebrate this, Catholic families attend Mass together on Sundays and Holy Days, and actively participate in the sacramental life of the Church. Also, recognizing that we sometimes struggle to *love* each other as we should, Catholic families regularly go to confession to seek God's healing, grace, and inspiration to *love* more fully.
- 2. Catholic Families Pray Together-Catholic families are called to *love* each other with the *love* that flows from God's own heart. We can only do this if we ask God-together-to teach us what this means. Therefore, in addition to both our individual prayer life and our worship with our parish communities, we gather together for family prayer each and every day. We use our daily, family prayer time to...Praise and thank God for his blessings. Ask forgiveness for the times we didn't *love* as we should. Ask for the grace to *love* each other and the world better. Pray for both our needs and the needs of the Family of God. Seek God's will for our life. We treat family prayer, not as a duty or a chore, but as the key to true intimacy and joy in our home.
- 3. Catholic Families are Called to Intimacy-Most importantly, the Christian life is a call to intimate communion. Catholic families serve that goal by being schools of love where we learn how to love God and each other with our whole hearts, minds, souls, and strength. To do this, we constantly seek new ways to be even more open with and *loving* to each other as husband and wife, parents and children. For instance; children are supposed to be the visible sign of the *loving* union between husband and wife. Catholic families live this out both in our openness to life and by working hard on the quality of our relationships with each other. To do this, we cultivate marriage and parenting habits that make each member of the family feel *loved* and valued and practice all the virtues that help us live life as a gift. For instance; we choose *loving* guidance approaches to discipline that teach virtue and good behavior instead of merely punishing wrongdoing. We schedule regular one-on-one time with each family member so that we can get to know each other's thoughts, feelings and heart's desires on the deepest level possible. And we take an active interest in all the things that each family member finds true, good and beautiful even when those interests don't come naturally to us.
- 4. Catholic Families Put Family First-Because our family relationships are the primary means God uses to help us become the people he created us to be, we treat family life, itself, as the most important activity in our week. We create and protect family rituals like regular family dinners, time for prayer and worship, weekly game nights and "family days," and regularly scheduled times for communication and relationship-building that give us regular time to work, play, talk and pray together. We hold these activities as sacred rituals of the domestic church and value them over all other activities that would seek to compete with them.
- 5. The Catholic Family is a Witness and Sign -We recognize that God wants to change the world through our families. We actively participate in this plan in two ways. First, we work hard to be witnesses of the *love*, joy and intimacy that every human heart longs for. We'll share this *love* in good times and bad, in sickness and health, for richer or poorer. Second, we carry this *love* outside the home by serving our community in a manner that keeps our family together. We intentionally practice the corporal and spiritual works of mercy within our home and outside of it. We regularly talk about how we can do a better job of living out our family mission to be a sign of God's *love* in the world.






