DIOCESAN POLICY - Expenditure Request Forms and Contract Review

Pursuant to Diocesan policy, all property improvement and other expenditures in excess of \$10,000 require the permission of the Bishop. In this regard, an Expenditure Request Form ("ERF") with the required supporting documentation is to be submitted to the Diocesan Finance Office for review and recommendation to the Bishop. CATHOLIC SCHOOL STUDENT SUBSIDY: The per student subsidy for the 2020-2021 school year will remain at \$90.00 per student. The subsidy is based on the allocation from the Bishop's Annual Appeal, donations received, and earnings on investments.

OFFICE OF THE DEACONS

DIACONATE MINISTRY INFORMATION SESSIONS: There will be two sessions this spring where information will be presented to those men of the diocese who are interested in applying for the permanent diaconate program for our diocese. Information will be provided regarding the ministry of the diaconate, the discernment/aspirancy year, and the formation program itself. It is anticipated that the discernment year will begin in September 2020, and the formation program will begin in September 2021, for a total of 5 years of discernment and formation. Bishop Vincke has chosen St. Meinrad Seminary and School of Theology to conduct the academic formation portion of the program at a yet-to-be-determined location in our diocese.

RURAL LIFE COMMISION: The Rural Life Winter Seminar will be March 7, 2020, in the Hall of Bishops at the Sacred Heart Cathedral in Salina. The seminar will focus on agricultural ethics, conservation, and a path to farming for service members and veterans. Check-in will begin at 9:30 A.M. with the seminar beginning at 10:00 A.M. Mass with Bishop Gerald Vincke will be at 11:30 A.M. followed by lunch and the afternoon speakers. Adjournment will be at 4:00 P.M.

Keynote speakers include Dr. Mykel Taylor, associate professor of agricultural economics at Kansas State University. Dr. Taylor specializes in farm management and grain marketing. Dr. Lucas Haag is a crop production and agronomy specialist for Northwest Kansas with Kansas State University Experiment Station in Colby. COL (Ret.) Gary LaGrange is with the Save the Farm Organization. Their objective is to provide occupational agricultural training to veterans and transitioning service members. The four pillars in the farm model are: transition, training, therapy, and succession.

Cost of the seminar is \$20 per adult and \$10 for children under 12 and includes lunch. On-line registration will begin February 1 at **salinadiocese.org/rural-life** and closes March 3. <u>EUCHARISTIC LENTEN STUDY</u> - All parishes across the Salina Diocese are invited to participate in a Lenten study on the Eucharist. The series, Presence, is available for free to all at <u>Formed.org</u>.

In addition to the content on **Formed.org**, supplemental videos, information and reflections will be available at the website, **salinadiocese.org**, and on social media channels.

Each session of Presence has been carefully designed to help participants discover the powerful way that God is present in the Eucharist, inviting all into an intimate union with himself. The series will examine the effects of the sacrament and its setting in the Mass, explore the scriptural foundation of the sacrament and discover the beauty of Holy Communion and the transformative power of the grace God offers us in this sacrament.

The Presence program is comprised of four sessions: God Is with Us, The Story of the Eucharist, Bread for the Journey and Biblical Foundations of the Eucharist.

- God Is with Us examines God's saving presence with his people throughout salvation history, culminating in the Incarnation and his abiding Real Presence in the Eucharist.
- The Story of the Eucharist looks at how the Eucharist was prefigured in the Old Testament and in Jesus's miracles and teaching.
- Bread for the Journey focuses on the necessity of the Eucharist for our spiritual nourishment and explores the different parts of the Liturgy of the Mass.

OFFICE OF COMMUNICATIONS (cont.)

• Biblical Foundations of the Eucharist responds to objections to the Church's doctrine of the Eucharist with biblical apologetics. Understanding and responding to the objections of those who disagree with us (apologetics) is an important part of evangelization.

Each parish or family is encouraged to form their own discussion groups. The program is structured such that the four sessions may be completed over the course of four separate meetings or together at one longer (day-long) seminar.

BISHOP'S ANNUAL APPEAL - Call to Share - launches weekend of February 8 and 9.

The Bishop's Annual Appeal – Call to Share is coming upon us quickly. The launch weekend is February 8 and 9. The materials are at the printers and will be mailed to each at your parishes. They should arrive the first week in February.

Please lend your voice to the appeal this year. Your voice makes a big difference in how your parishioners respond. The parish manual, included in the packet mailed to you, will have talking points and steps for you to take. Review it.

By the time you meet for the Clergy Renewal Days, the appeal will have kicked off. I will be presenting at your conference in Wichita and am looking forward to hearing how the appeal is going in all your parishes. This also gives us an opportunity to discuss the "Participation Weekend" scheduled for March 21 and 22.

This year's minimum goal is \$1.6 million. When you get your parish manual, you will see that this goal will be achievable if each of you are able to raise the same in your parish as you raised last year. The extra funds will come from the lead gift effort.

As in years past, much of this annual appeal, supports the ministries every parish uses. About 90% of the gifts received support one of these four areas: 1) seminarian education, 2) health care and retirement of clergy, 3) education, and 4) evangelization/ministries. The smallest portion, only 10%, goes to support the general operations of the Chancery. A chart is attached to this SDNB showing how the gifts are used.

The appeal begins in February and will run through March. All active solicitations in the churches will be completed by Palm Sunday. Like last year, there will be time to keep the message and information in front of Catholics and call them to action. We want each family to have the time to take three steps with us:

- 1. **Listen and learn** what is the campaign and how does it impact them and their parish.
- 2. **Pray and discuss** with the information in hand, take time to pray individually and as a family about the role of the Church in their lives and of their responsibility in addressing current and future needs (as our parents and grandparents did for us)
- 3. **Decide and act** based on prayer and discussion each family can come to a decision of what they can do in 2020 and the terms of the gift. Finally, announce that gift by *completing the pledge card and returning it*.

OFFICE OF SAFETY AND SECURITY

PARISH AND SCHOOL AUDITS - Thank you for your patience as we plan and coordinate parish/school audits for 2020. After some discussion we have determined that in lieu of individual on-site visits we will hold mandatory Safety Coordinator trainings in each Deanery. This will give us the opportunity to train new Safety Coordinators in CMGConnect and review with our seasoned Safety Coordinators the recent changes and updates to the system. We will also look at the other ways CMGConnect can be a valuable resource to your parishes and schools. We will also discuss/review other important aspects of your Safe Environment program (i.e. Safe Environment Training for Children). Like the audits, we will check to make sure all volunteers and employees in your parish/school are current with their safe environment training and background check. There will also be time for questions and individual trainings if they are needed. The time allotted at each of these meeting will be 3 hours, with the third hour being a time for individual training/questions. If you do not have any questions or concerns, you are free to leave after hour two. If you have a laptop computer please bring it, along with any other materials you have as part of your Safe Environment Program for your Parish/School. An email will be forthcoming regarding the signup process for these mandatory meetings. We will offer multiple times to accommodate schedules, as we continue our mission, promise to protect, pledge to heal.

CMGCONNECT 2.0 UPDATE - Thank you for your patience and support during the recent relaunch of the CMGConnect data base. CMGConnect will continue to make updates and add new features during the first quarter of 2020. We have some updated instruction sheets and others will be available soon. As we get updated instruction sheets from CMG, we will work to customize them for the Safety Coordinators in the Diocese of Salina. These updates and changes will be part of the mandatory Safety Coordinator training meetings forthcoming.

CHILDREN'S TRAINING DATA REPORT (aka Testimony of Compliance Form) - A kind reminder to those who have **not** yet returned this form, please do so as soon as possible! This information is very important as we prepare the data for the Annual Diocesan Audit. Feel free to contact our office if you have any questions.

CERTIFICATION STATUS SHEETS - If you have not turned in your form for Religious Education teachers and/or School teachers, coaches and support staff, please do so as soon as possible so they may be verified and filed.

All those who minister to children or young people are to be educated through the CMGConnect Training Program - a program that specializes in helping churches and religious organizations create safe environments for children and youth. This training program educates adults about the nature of child sexual abuse, how it is perpetrated, how to report it, and strategies for prevention.







In our Catholic faith, the month of February is traditionally dedicated to the Holy Family. Victor David, in his blog cast for the Catholic Apostolate Center, combines LOVE and the Holy Family and calls it The Holy Family-The Splendor of Love.

The quote above is from a prayer Pope Francis recites in an exhortation from Amoris Laeitia.

In just those few words, we are reminded of the importance of the Holy Family; they are the perfect reflection of true love.

They exemplify to us what it means to love God and one another. What is true love?

Merriam-Webster dictionary defines true love as a "strong affection for another". The definition from the Gospel of John (15:18), "no one has greater love than this, to lay down ones' life for ones' friends". True love, then, is self-sacrificial. It means that we actively seek the best for OTHERS, it does not mean we live to seek the best for ourselves.
