- Please **respond no later** than Friday, March 1, for Hays and Friday, March 8, for Salina. Also indicate which location they will attend the Rite of Election.
- If a person is completing Confirmation only, they do not go through the Rite of Election.
- If a youth is younger than age 7 the youth does not go through the Rite of Election.
- Please note on your list if any people are related and what that relationship is.
- The Bishop will send a personal letter of invitation to each Candidate and Catechumen. The letter is available in English and Spanish. Please indicate if you want the letter sent in Spanish (or Spanish and English) to any individuals.
- Thank you for sending the above information which will help the Liturgy Office plan these celebrations.

OFFICE OF FINANCE

INTEREST RATES for Deposits & Loans:

During the December 4th meeting of the Diocesan Finance Council, the following interest rate recommendations were made to Bishop Vincke: (1) Effective January 1, 2019, an increase in the interest rate paid on deposits (SCs and LPs) from the current rate of 2.00% to 2.25%; (2) The interest rate paid on endowment funds (ED) to remain the same at 5%; and (3) The interest rate charged on loans to remain the same at 3.25%.

At the present time, the Council anticipates making additional interest rate change recommendations to the Bishop that would become effective July 1, 2019 and (1) increase the interest rate paid on deposits (SCs and LPs) to 2.50% and (2) increase the interest rate charged on loans to 4.25%. These recommendations are subject to change based on interest rate changes and economic forecasts made by the Federal Reserve during the first-half of 2019.

The endowed funds make annual distributions of an amount up to 5% of the net fair market value of the last twelve rolling quarters of the fund.

MILEAGE RATE: The IRS has announced a new current mileage rate used to calculate the deductible costs for travel. The recommended standard mileage rate for business is **58 cents per mile**. The Diocese will begin following this rate effective January 1, 2019.

CORPORATE ANNUAL REPORTS: The annual report for each parish corporation required by the Kansas Secretary of State has been filed by the Finance Office. The fee for the report for each parish is \$40.00. Please remit this fee to the Finance Office for each parish at your earliest convenience.

Trend Data on Clergy Sexual Abuse of Minors

Since 2004, CARA has been compiling an annual report for the USCCB on new allegations of sexual abuse of minors by diocesan and religious clergy, as well as the amount of money expended as a result of allegations and on child protection efforts.

The clergy sex abuse scandal unfolding in the news today is the same public scandal that erupted with national media reports in 2002 (beginning in Boston). It is likely, but no one can be sure, that the cases in the Pennsylvania grand jury report have already been present in existing allegation totals (reports to the John Jay researchers are cited as a source for information about allegations in the grand jury report). Just as then, the abuse in the headlines most often occurred in the 1960s through the 1980s.

Have new allegations of abuse declined as a result of the *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People*? The John Jay researchers aggregated the number of allegations of clergy sexual abuse of minors from 1950 to 2002. Their study included allegations made by 10,667 individuals. CARA's studies, from 2004 through 2017, include 8,694 allegations. The distribution of cases reported to CARA are nearly identical to the distribution of cases, over time, in John Jay's results. We know the year that each alleged abuse began for 8,206 cases. For 488, this is not known. The accompanying figure below shows the cases where we can place these in time. The pattern of allegations repeats the pattern shown in the John Jay study: more than two-thirds of reported alleged offenses either occurred or began in the mid-1980s or earlier.

New abuse allegations have not disappeared. In the last three years, 22 allegations of abuse occurring during 2015-2017 have been reported, an average of about seven per year nationwide in the Church. That is far too many. Nothing is acceptable other than zero. At the same time, to put those reports in some context, 42 teachers

in the state of Pennsylvania, where the grand jury reported from, lost their licenses to educate for sexual misconduct in 2017.

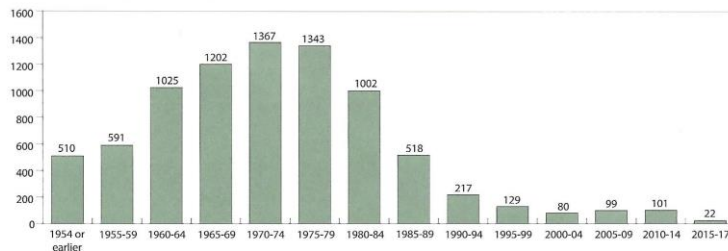

the last 15 years. But you cannot "fix" the past nor can it be erased. This won't all fade away. You have to deal with it. The Church did not sufficiently do so in 2002 and the years that followed. Creating new policies to prevent future abuse are a necessary but not a sufficient response to the legacy of what happened.

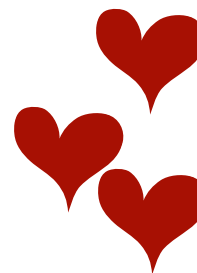

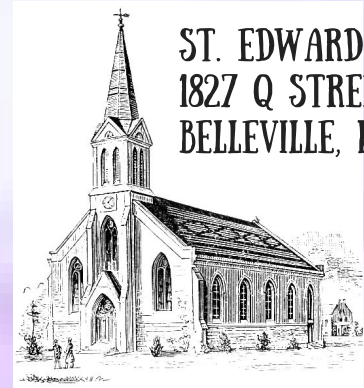

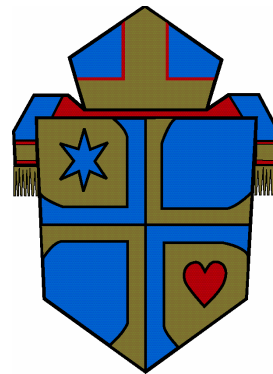
