OFFICE OF THE DIOCESAN ADMINISTRATOR

NEW BISHOP: The decision was announced from Rome on June 13 that Monsignor Gerald (Jerry) Lee Vincke would become the 12th Bishop of our diocese. Bishop-elect Vincke traveled to Salina that same day to meet with the Chancery staff, participate in a press conference, and begin the transitioning process. Additionally, we have firm dates set for the Vespers and Ordination of Bishop-elect Jerry Vincke. **He will celebrate Vespers with the priests and deacons on the evening of August 21. The Episcopal ordination will be August 22.** Both liturgies will be at the cathedral. Invitations and further details will be sent out at a later time. I ask that you continue to keep the Bishop-elect in your prayers as we await his long-anticipated ordination and installation.

THANK YOU all for supporting the annual Peters' Pence Collection the weekend of June 30-July 1, 2018 to help support the marginalized and suffering around the world.

I would also like to extend my gratitude to all those in attendance at the recent ordination of Fr. Andrew Hammeke. I am most grateful that so many priests and lay people showed their support through their attendance and prayers at the ordination. Additionally, we are blessed to have the support of the Development Office who hosted the Annual Seminarian Recognition Dinner fundraiser at the Salina Country Club. The evening was an enjoyable one with delicious food and excellent company, as well as the wondrous announcement that we will have five new seminarians this coming fall. What a blessing it is to have such an involved and supportive diocese. Let us continue to keep the seminarians in our prayers.

CONFIRMATION 2018-19: A special thanks to those pastors who have already turned in their parish request forms. As a reminder, a completed form must be submitted by **Friday**, **July 13**, **2018**, *even if Confirmation is not scheduled for this year*. A schedule will be prepared after all forms are returned with plans for the First Draft to be included with the August SDNB. Please do not finalize plans until you receive the final schedule in September. Thank you to the parishes scheduling Confirmations every second, third, or fourth year (based on the size of the class); especially if there are fewer than ten students per year. Pastors are encouraged to combine parishes within their pastoral assignment. The form can be found in last month's SDNB or on the Diocesan website.

During the month of **July**, we invite you to slow down and read the attached issue of *The Shepherd*. It is a review of the policies and procedures that have been put into place to protect our children. Even during the summer, we must remain vigilant of the importance of keeping our children safe, at home, in our churches and in the community.

OFFICE OF SAFETY AND SECURITY (cont.)

ATTENTION SAFETY COORDINATORS: The month of July will go fast and soon you will be preparing for yet another school year. In the next week, please sign in to CMG and go to your dashboard. There you will see "Certification Expiring within the next 60 days and Background Check Expiring within the next 60 days." Please check to see if any of your employees or volunteers are listed. If they will be volunteering or are employed at your parish or school, please contact them so they can update their training/background check. Once completed their certification is valid for 5 years, unless there is an incident for which they must be asked to resign. If they do not renew their training and background check prior to their expiration date, they are not allowed to minister with minors in your parish until they have completed the training.

Instructions for those who need to renew can be found in the resources section of CMGConnect, or on the Safety and Security page of the Diocesan website. It is our recommendation that you give them printed instructions. They should SIGN IN with the email or username associated with their account, rather than creating a new account. If they no longer know their username or email, the Safety Coordinator can find the information in their "profile." It may or may not be their current email. If they do not know their password, they should use the password "safe." If they are having difficulty signing in, please have them contact the Safety and Security Office at the Chancery. Again, please do not have them create a new account as we want to track all their trainings from their original account.

A "checklist" to each of the Safety Coordinators will be forthcoming. It will have important dates and items to be taken care of during the "year." This is a review of what you have done in the past, but a helpful tool to use as you prepare the students and adults of your parishes for the coming year.

During the June 2018 Plenary Assembly, The Charter for the Protection and Children and Young People was revised and approved by the USCCB. The revised Charter can be found at www.usccb.or/charter. We will be sending out more information regarding the changes very soon. Thank you for your continued prayers and dedication to fostering cultures of protection and healing.



Please let your congregation know that you have pledge cards and remittance envelopes available for those who need them and make those items readily available at the weekend masses, August 4-5 and 11-12.

Diocese of Salina Safe Environment Program Important Info

All adult employees, volunteers, and clergy working with minors on a regular basis must complete Safe Environment Training along with submitting a background check (all through the website salina.cmgconnect.org) and be CERTIFIED in the CMGConnect data base. If you are not CERTIFIED in the CMGConnect data base you will not be able to minister for any parish activity that involves minors.

- ▲ All Adult Safe Environment trainings and background checks are good for 5 years.
- △ High School students (grades 9-10-11-12) ministering with minors on a regular basis must complete the Safe Environment Training through CMGConnect. High School students not yet 18 and volunteering will complete the High School training curriculum. High School students, not yet 18 will need to update their training every year. High School students (18 and over) will need to complete the Adult training curriculum through CMGConnect which includes the background check. If you are a high school student applying to be a camp counselor for Jr. CYO camp, please contact your Parish/School Safety Coordinator for complete training instructions.
- △Junior High Students (grades 6-7-8) ministering with minors must read and sign (along with their parents) the Teen Code of Conduct. (This form can be found at http://salinadiocese.org/safety-security) This form is then kept on file at the parish or school. This training also needs to be updated on a yearly basis.
- △ All students in religious education classes and in Catholic Schools must be trained in some type of Safety Curriculum (i.e. Child Lures, Happy Bear, Kidsmartz) yearly. This is documented through the Testimony of Compliance Form which can be found at http://salinadiocese.org/safety-security and must be signed by the Safety Coordinator and Parish Priest and/ or Principal and by January 1st of each year.
- ▲ The role of the Safety Coordinator of the Parish/School is to distribute the written instructions to all those needing Safe Environment Training for the Diocese of Salina and follow up with them to make certain they have completed it before ministering with minors and answer any questions they may have. The Safety Coordinator also monitors the CMGConnect data base (please do this at least weekly). Is everyone in the data base who should be, did they complete the correct curriculum, do they need to renew their training and background check?

Safety Coordinators: Please note, it is *very* important that each individual logging into the CMGConnect data base enter accurate and complete information and complete the correct curriculum. It is recommended they complete the curriculum in one sitting.

Here is a sample announcement (Safety Coordinator's please fill in the blanks in whatever way you would like people to contact you) to use in your parish bulletin, staff newsletter, bulletin board, etc... so that ALL parish and school employees and volunteers working with minors can follow the protocol and know who to contact to complete Safe Environment Training for the Diocese of Salina.

Each Parish and School in the Diocese of Salina has a *Safety Coordinator*. The Safety Coordinator of your parish or school is _______. The Safety Coordinator serves a very important role, each one serves as an extension of the Diocese of Salina, but also to the Office of Child and Youth Protection (OCYP). This position was designed to help the Pastor/Principal coordinate the implementation of the parish and or school compliance requirements designed to keep minors safe at their locations. The Safety Coordinator of your parish has a thorough understanding of Safe Environment Policies and procedures and takes care of all the record keeping, reporting and communicating the importance of a safe environment and models behaviors that support the *Promise to Protect, Pledge to Heal*.

If you currently work or volunteer with minors at your parish or school your Safety Coordinator has your Safe Environment training records.

If you are **NEW** to the Parish or school or you need to **UPDATE** (if has been over 5 years since your last training/background check) and you want to work or volunteer with minors or continue to work or volunteer with minors at the parish or school, please contact ______so he/she can get you started/updated with the Safe Environment Training for our Diocese.

The Safety Coordinator will oversee your training, answer any questions you may have and make sure your training is properly recorded.

If you have questions, please contact your Parish/School Safety Coordinator_____.

We recommend posting this "blurb" yearly so people are aware of who to contact at their local parish/school.





Natural Family Planning (NFP) is an umbrella term for modern, healthy, scientifically accurate, and reliable methods of family planning.

NFP methods are different from and better than artificial contraception because they cooperate with, rather than suppress, a couple's fertility; can be used both to achieve and avoid pregnancy; call for shared responsibility and cooperation by husband and wife; require spousal communication; foster respect for and acceptance of the total person; have no harmful side effects; and are virtually cost free. NFP is unique because it enables its users to work with the body rather than against it. Fertility is viewed as a reality to live, not a problem to be solved.

How Natural Family Planning Changed My Life

As a child I was baptized Catholic, but essentially grew up with no religious practice. As a married adult, I reentered the Church, and soon after felt a tugging at my heart to stop practicing contraception. At that time, I did not know about Natural Family Planning (NFP). More basic, I did not know about Church teachings on the moral practice of family planning. What I would learn about God's design for my married life and through the practice of NFP would change my life.

True Freedom and Openness to Life

When my husband, Ariel and I took an NFP class, I have to admit that I was scared. Giving up control, was frightening! It was one thing to be committed to an ideal, but something quite different to follow through on it. It definitely involved a leap of faith! Over time and with some experience, I began to appreciate the gift and beauty of NFP. In practicing NFP, my husband and I must decide if we, as a couple, are ready to embrace the possibility of a new life in each menstrual cycle. When we had used contraception, we ignored this reality. With NFP we could not ignore how God made us— as a man and a woman. NFP helped us understand the relationship that God designed between the marital act and procreation. It has made us "open to life." It even brought our last two children into the family!

The Gift of Self

In using NFP over the years both my husband and I, now see that we give ourselves to each other fully in the marital act. For us, the idea of contraception has become almost vulgar. It cheapens the marital act. Contraception seems to say: "I love you, honey, but I don't love you THAT much." NFP also guards against the objectification of the woman in the relationship. Contraception often keeps the woman in a defensive position because it allows "intimacy on demand." NFP does not allow this because of the practice of periodic abstinence when not seeking a pregnancy. A deeper equality between husband and wife can be nurtured with NFP. NFP begins the process of this awareness.

Growing together in holiness

The sacrifices that NFP entails have only served to make me a better person and more devoted to the Lord. Without knowing it, using contraception promotes the idea that children are a burden. Children do require lots of work, and pregnancy demands its own set of sacrifices, but NFP has helped me meet these challenges by leading me to the realization that children are God's blessings. I am constantly forced to pray, change, make concessions and find solutions to the selfishness and laziness that come up often when meeting the needs of others. Today, I am confident that had I not been open to life in the practice of NFP, I would not have needed to depend on God, and not have grown as a person. This growth benefits my family and the people I meet in everyday life. Jesus calls us to serve others. Marriage and parenthood are ways we can immediately apply this call in our lives. NFP has led me to be more open to life, more aware of God's design for intimacy in marriage, more dependent on Him to fulfill these plans. It has strengthened my relationship with my husband, given me personal insight and it has given our children life!
