The Diocese of Salina fully participates in all criminal investigations related to abuse perpetrated by a member of the clergy or other church official.

All reports are confidential with the exception of those involving the abuse of minors, which will be immediately reported by the Diocese to the proper authorities, as required by Kansas State Law and Diocesan Policy.

SAFE ENVIRONMENT NEWSLETTER: Summer Break is in full swing. For many kids, more free time equals more screen time-but it doesn't have to. Please see the attached issue of our Safe Environment Newsletter, *The Shepherd*. The newsletter contains information regarding social media; specifically, information about certain apps, what they do, do they have a benefit, and whether or not it can expose your child to danger. Even during the summer, we must remain vigilant on the importance of keeping our children safe at home, in our churches and in the community.

How are you keeping your kids safe over summer break?

ATTENTION SAFETY COORDINATORS: The month of July will go fast and soon you will be preparing for yet another school year. In the next week, please sign in to CMG and go to your dashboard. There you will see "Certification Expiring within the next 60 days and Background Check Expiring within the next 60 days." Please check to see if any of your employees or volunteers are listed. If they will be volunteering or are employed at your parish or school, please contact them so they can update their training/background check. Once completed their certification is valid for 5 years, unless there is an incident for which they must be asked to resign. If they do not renew their training and background check prior to their expiration date, they are not allowed to minister with minors in your parish until they have completed the training.

Instructions for those who need to renew can be found in the resources section of CMGConnect, or on the Safety and Security page of the Diocesan website. It is our recommendation that you give them printed instructions. *If they are having difficulty signing in, please have them contact the Safety and Security Office at the Chancery*. Again, please do not have them create a new account as we want to track all their trainings from their original account.

2019 RURAL LIFE DAY RURAL LIFE DAY will be at St. Frances Cabrini Parish in Hoxie, KS, Sunday, August 18. 2019. We will begin at 3:00 P.M. with an opening prayer. The main feature of the Rural Life Day is presenting the Msgr. John George Weber Century Farm Award to families who have farmed or owned their farm for 100 years or longer. Families applying for the award are asked to prepare a brief (5 minutes +/-) history of their family farm; their hardships, successes, how faith played a major role, family succession for the operation of the farm, etc.

Photographs of the families and the family histories will be placed in *The Register*. While we are targeting farms and families in the West Deanery, any family in the Diocese may apply. Families in your parish who qualify for the Century Farm Award may apply by filling the application found on the Diocesan Website under Rural Life. REMINDER FOR PRIESTS: We need to make sure Notifications of sacraments are not only included in the registers of the parishes where the sacrament was administered, but also notification of the parish of Baptism must also be made [i.e. if a couple is married in Colby, it is recorded in Colby's Marriage Register. But notification of the marriage must also be sent to the parish where each member was baptized e.g. Goodland (groom) and Pilsen (bride).]

This fall we will have a meeting in each of the 4 deaneries for the adults that will be sponsors for NCYC. Watch for those dates.



July – Keeping Kids Safe Over Summer Break

Summer break is something kids look forward to all year; the freedom that comes with longer days and no set schedule is a wonderful thing, but it can a be stressful time for parents.


During the school year, there's usually no question where your kids are during the day. Classes, clubs, and sports keep them occupied and generally in the same location. But during the summer, there are sleepovers, visits to the pool, trips to the movies, countless other warm-weather activities, and more down time than normal.

Just because kids aren't in the classroom doesn't mean they're not still in contact with people. In fact, over the summer, kids will be communicating via email, text, or social media, and this can become a breeding ground for potential drama.

All kids who are "online" are at risk for cyberbullying. The CDC estimates that cyberbullying affects about 15.5 percent of high school students. In comparison, about 20 percent of high-schoolers experience in-person bullying at school. Some kids are more vulnerable to

cyberbullying than others. It happens more often to girls than boys. Cyberbullying can happen anywhere kids can connect. Apps that allow users to remain anonymous, such as Kik Messenger and Yik Yak, have been linked to highprofile cyberbullying cases. But, plenty of cyberbullying happens over text, over instant messaging and in social media contents.

As a Community of Faith

As parents and a community of Faith, we play an important role in ensuring all children are safe from bullying. Here are a few suggestions how we can try to prevent and respond to cyberbullying.

- + Establish rules about technology use with your child. Help them be smart about what they post or say.
- + Recognize the warning signs, many times kids won't ask for help, so it is important to know what to look for.
- + Learn what bullying is and what it is not. Cyberbullying requires different strategies than in-person bullying.

ADDS SDECIEICALLY KNOWN TO BE DANGEBOUS FOR KIDS

WHISPER- Whisper allows you to post secrets anonymously and allows you to chat with other users in your geographic area. **Why is it**dangerous? Many children are drawn to communicating with strangers, feeling that their secrets are safer with a stranger than with their friends. The app is a perfect tool for ill-intentioned strangers looking to connect with young people because it allows them to exchange messages with people nearest them.

YIKYAK- All YikYak users are anonymous, they don't create a profile or an account, but they can post comments that are accessible to the nearest 500 people (within a 1-5 mile radius). In fact, a psychiatrist called YikYak the most dangerous app he'd ever seen because it "can turn a school into a chat room where everyone can post his or her comments anonymously. Untruthful, mean, character assassinating short messages are immediately seen by all users in a specific geographic area." Why is it dangerous? This app is causing problems in schools across the United States, with students maliciously slandering teachers, staff, and other students.

KIK- Kik is a free app-based alternative texting service that allows texts/pictures to be sent without being logged in the phone history. Similar apps are Viber, WhatsApp, and TextNow. **Why is it dangerous?** Kik makes it easier for your child to talk to strangers without your knowledge since it bypasses the wireless providers short message services (SMS). In addition, strangers can send your child a "friend request."

SNAPCHAT- Snapchat allows users to capture an image or a video and make it available to friends who can then share with possible unintended users. Pictures and videos automatically disappear forever unless the user saves it to their memories. Additionally, Snapchat has a map screen where others can see the users exact location in real time. **Why is it dangerous?** Kids can receive or send inappropriate photos. This app can also make kids feel like they can send inappropriate pictures without the consequences because the image will self-destruct automatically—or so they think. The truth is that nothing sent over the internet disappears which could ultimately affect future careers. The location feature could allow predators to know exactly where your child is located.

VINE- Vine allows users to watch and post six second videos. *Why is it dangerous?* While many videos are harmless, pornographic videos do pop up into the feed and a child could easily search for and access pornographic videos. Additionally, predators utilize this app to search for teens and find their location. They can even connect with the teens via messaging apps.

CHATROULETTE AND OMEGLE- These apps allow you to video chat with strangers. Why is this dangerous? Not only are users chatting with strangers, they could be chatting with fake strangers. Chat sites like ChatRoulette and Omegle have done their best to produce systems that warn users when people they are chatting with are potentially using fake webcam software. However, developers still manage to slip under their radars with frequent updates. So, a predator could use a fake webcam and use images from another child or teen and convince your child to send inappropriate pictures or get information about your child's location.

POOF- Poof hides other apps on your phone. You can select which apps you would like to hide and their icons will no longer show up on your smartphone screen. Why is it dangerous? If a child has apps they want to hide from their parents, all they have to do is download Poof and their screen is clear of any questionable apps. Remember, as a parent your child's safety is more important than their privacy. As a parent, you aren't being nosy or invading privacy by checking your child's cell phone; you are being responsible. It is a good idea to establish family media rules, such as having to check with a parent before downloading a new app or game. Also, explain to your child why you are asking them questions and checking their phone or tablet. Many children don't understand how much information is on the world wide web, how dangerous it could be, and the potential life- long implications.

10 Social Media Rules for Teens • Never post or send anything on social media that you wouldn't want the whole world to see. • Never talk negatively about others in text messages or on social media. • If you are part of a conversation where someone talks negatively, leave the conversation. • Never bully others on social media. • Never post or send photos of yourself in any state of undress. • Always ask permission before posting photos of others. • Never post memes that are pornographic, racist, or otherwise hurtful to others. • Never have an argument via text or on social media—work out your differences in person. • Do not impersonate others on social media. • Remember the golden rule when using social media. If you wouldn't like someone writing something about you, don't write it about others.
