TRIAL PROGRAM – CHANCERY OFFICE – PROPOSED SUMMER HOURS' POLICY. The Chancery Office will be implementing a trial program regarding a proposed *Summer Hours' Policy* for the chancery non-exempt (hourly) employees. The trial program will begin Friday, February 16, 2018 and end April 1, 2018. During this time period, on Friday's beginning at noon, the receptionist will no longer be answering the phones and the chancery will be closed. The answering system will be turned on during this period. This protected time period will allow the receptionist, as well as other non-exempt employees, time to complete essential duties. Please be advised this is only a trial program to gauge whether a *Summer Hours' Policy* for the chancery would be feasible. Any exception to the regular work schedule must meet the business needs of the chancery office. Upon completion of the trial program, the Diocesan Administrator will assess if the proposed *Summer Hours' Policy* will be implemented during the summer months. I need the following information with every photo in order to run it in The Register:

- Parish name/city
- What the event was (1st communion, confirmation, etc.)
- \underline{DATE} of the event

• Name of <u>ALL</u> people in the photo. The following format is best:

First row (left to right): Jane Smith, Bob Brown, Carrie Linneburger, Father Jack Smith Second row (left to right): Jack Green, Suzie Quinn, Arnold Hund Third row (left to right): John Jones, Ann Lyon, Cassie Hays

In a recent column on the vocation of Christian men, Archbishop Chaput wrote, "*The world needs faithful Catholic men, men with a hunger to be saints. The role of a Catholic husband and father—a man who sacrifices his own desires, out of love, to serve the needs of his wife and children—is the living cornerstone of a Christian home. The Church in this country may face a very hard road in the next 20 years, and her sons need to step up and lead by the witness of their daily lives." He was a cafeteria Catholic for a couple of years until he heard Scott Hahn's "Conversion Story" and was moved by the Holy Spirit to delve deeply into Bible apologetics. 
