DEPARTMENT OF LABOR EMPLOYMENT POSTERS: Throughout the year, you may receive mailings that pertain to employee related posters that either the Federal or State government mandates be displayed in the workplace site. Please be advised, specific employment posters should be displayed in a conspicuous area where employees frequent and are likely to read. For practical purposes, that usually translates to the break room. Many question which posters should be posted, as required by law, and which are not required. You may go online to http://www.dol.ks.gov/Laws/Posters.aspx, which is the website to the Kansas Department of Labor. It lists the posters that need to be posted in the workplace site. You may also download the posters free of charge from that site. From time to time, the Department of Labor will send an auditor to places of business to inspect postings to ensure the business is in compliance with the law. If the appropriate posters are not displayed your workplace could be fined for each poster not displayed. To keep your schools and parish offices in compliance, I am recommending that each of you either download each poster (free of charge) from the abovementioned website and post the required posters individually at your workplace site or order an all-in-one poster for Kansas from a reputable company that specializes in selling these types of posters. The all-in-one poster will contain all of the postings required in Kansas so that you won't have to clutter your workplace site with many different posters. FACILITY USAGE AND SPECIAL EVENTS COVERAGE FOR PARISHES IN OUR DIOCESE BY AND THROUGH CATHOLIC MUTUAL:

There are specific guidelines set by Catholic Mutual for when non parish sponsored or affiliated groups use parish facilities on a short-term basis. The Facility Usage Agreement requires the facility user to provide the parish with a certificate of insurance documenting general liability coverage in the amount of \$1,000,000 per occurrence. This certificate of insurance must name your parish and the Arch/Diocese as an additional insured. If the leasing party owns a home, they can request a Certificate of Liability from their personal insurance company. Some insurance companies will provide the Certificate of Liability and list the Parish as a "Certificate Holder" only. This is not acceptable, because listing the Parish as a "Certificate Holder" does not provide any liability coverage to the Parish or Diocese. If the leasing party cannot obtain a Certificate of Liability from their insurance company then a Parish representative should contact Sara O'Neil at the Catholic Mutual office to request Special Events Coverage. Sara can be reached at 800-228-6108 ext. 2361

Special Events Coverage guidelines:

- 1. The Parish will need to purchase a minimum of five (5) Special Event Coverage policies at the cost of \$475.00.
- 2. The Parish can purchase more than 5 Special Event Coverage's, but the minimum purchase is 5.
- 3. After the initial purchase of Special Event Coverage, for an upcoming function, the Parish will need to complete an application for Special Events (15 days prior to the event but not more than 6 months in advance) and submit to Sara O'Neil for approval and issue of the Special Event policy.
- 4. The cost of one Special Event policy is \$95 to the Parish. The Parish can add a reasonable fee to the cost of the Special Events policy to cover administrative costs.

If you are questioning what criteria an organization must meet to be parish sponsored or affiliated ask these questions:

- 1. Did the parish have full control over the group or function?
- 2. Did any costs or fees associated with the function flow through parish accounts?
- 3. Was the function or group open to all parish members?
- 4. Was the purpose of the function or group to facilitate learning, raise revenue for the parish or provide a social service on behalf of the parish?
- 5. Was the teacher or leader of the group a parish volunteer or employee?

If the group does not fall into the categories above they must sign a Facility Usage/Indemnity Agreement and supply the parish with the necessary insurance documentation.
