ARCHBISHOP CHARLES CHAPUT, O.F.M. CAP.

Charles Joseph Chaput, OFM Cap. was born in Concordia, KS, September 26, 1944. He went to grade school at Our Lady of Perpetual Help Catholic School in Concordia, Kansas. Deciding to become a priest at the age of 13, he attended St. Francis Seminary High School in Victoria, Kansas. At age 21 Chaput entered the Order of Friars Minor Capuchin, a branch of the Franciscans, and On July 14, 1968, he made his solemn profession as a Capuchin friar.

Chaput is an American prelate of the Catholic Church. He is the ninth and current bishop of Philadelphia, installed on September 8, 2011, and previously served as Archbishop of Denver and Bishop of Rapid City.

Among his many endeavors and accomplishments Chaput is also an renowned author and writes an excellent column on CatholicPhilly.com.

The world needs faithful Catholic men, men with a hunger to be saints. The role of a Catholic husband and father- a man who sacrifices his own desires, out of love, to serve the needs of his wife and children- is the living cornerstone of a Christian home. The Church in this country may face a very hard road in the next 20 years, and her sons need to step up and lead by the witness of their daily lives.”

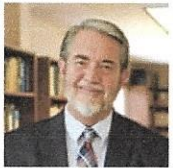
FR. WILLIAM WAGNER, ORC

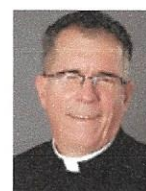

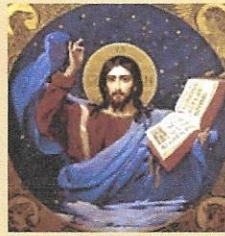

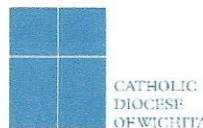
