**OCTOBER IS RESPECT LIFE MONTH.** Promotional and educational materials from the USCCB were mailed to each parish the 2<sup>nd</sup> week of September, 2015. This annual observance is a good opportunity to highlight the Church's teachings on the dignity of the human person and the sanctity of life from conception through natural death. The theme chosen for this year's Respect Life Program is: "EVERY LIFE IS WORTH LIVING" and how this truth affects both our understanding of ourselves and others and the way we live. On Respect Life Sunday, October 4<sup>th</sup> 2015 and especially throughout this month of October, please join me in reflection and prayer for the sacredness of every human being. In light of the timely topic, all priests, deacons, Parish Life Coordinators, Pastoral Associates and those involved in leadership of family life in the parish are invited. **MARRIAGE ANNIVERSARY MASSES:** Special appreciation to St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish, Salina and to Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish, Hays for hosting this year's Marriage Anniversary Masses in October, 2015. Also many thanks to the Family Life Office for organizing this event in our diocese to celebrate the gift of wedding anniversaries.

**PRIESTHOOD SUNDAY** is October 25<sup>th</sup> and is a special day set aside to honor the priesthood in the United States. It is a day to reflect upon and affirm the role of the priesthood in the life of the Church as a central one and is designed to be an event led by the laity. In the wake of the clergy sex abuse scandal, there has been concern that the image of all priests has been tainted by the actions of a few. Priesthood Sunday sends a message to all that the sins of a few do not reflect the innocent majority, and that the

parish priest, as the instrument of Christ's ministry on earth, is loved and respected by those in the parish<sup>2</sup> community. Without a priest, no parish is able to be a Eucharistic Community.

#### **OFFICE OF THE MARRIAGE TRIBUNAL**

Pope Francis and Reforms to Marriage Nullity Process: As you have heard through the mass media and Catholic news outlets, Pope Francis has made a few reforms to the marriage nullity process. These reforms become effective onDecember 8, 2015. A more detailed explanation of what these changes may mean for petitioners and those assisting petitioners will be forthcoming as additional explanations are provided by canonists and curia officials in Rome. However, there are a few things we already know. First, the reforms do not change our beliefs about the permanency or indissolubility of marriage; The Church still presumes every marriage is valid unless that presumption can be overturned with evidence. The law still favors the validity of any sacrament. Second, petitions for marriage nullity submitted prior to December 8th will adhere to the familiar and ordinary procedures we have followed in the past. Third, the ordinary process of gathering information (i.e. petitioner's preliminary questionnaire, petitioner's narrative, witness testimony, etc.) will be maintained even after the reforms become effective. What this means is that the practices and procedures priests and parish ministers have followed in the past when assisting someone who wants to submit a petitioner for marriage nullity will not change. Most of the reforms Pope Francis has initiated affect the internal workings of the tribunal, hopefully making the process more efficient and allowing tribunal judges to make more timely decisions regarding petitions for marriage nullity. More information will be forthcoming as we adjust to the new reforms and laws governing petitions for marriage nullity . -- Fr. Barry Brinkman, JV

Dear Priests and PLC's

As you know, we implemented some significant changes for *The Register* two years ago. The publication switched from 50 issues a year to twice monthly. The primary reason was to be able to send the newspaper to all of our Catholic families registered at a parish without substantially increasing our printing and mailing costs. Before that, only a third of households were subscribing.

Instead of requiring a \$20 subscription payment (and requiring parishes to have at least a third of their units subscribe or pay the difference) we asked for a \$20 donation. That effort proved quite successful. Also gratifying was the level of donations. Many people accepted our suggestion to add \$10 to their gift to help offset the cost of providing *The Register* to a family who couldn't afford to donate, and still others gave additional amounts to be added to *The Register's* endowment fund. In the end, about 3,900 households donated to this cause, with an average donation of \$25. We intend to continue this method of distributing *The Register* in 2016.

A Register donation envelope will be inserted in the Nov. 13 issue. Your help in publicizing this and urging your parishioners to donate would be greatly appreciated. While we were pleased with the donations received this year, we hope we can encourage more than 21 percent of our households to contribute.

Parishioners will be instructed to mail their donation to *The Register* in Salina. If some leave their envelopes in your collection plate, please forward them to us. You can wait until you have several to send. If checks are made to your parish, please deposit them and then mail a check to *The Register*. Again, you may wait until you have several and send one check with the names and addresses. In addition to using the envelope, parishioners can make donations online at .

We also thank you for your office's cooperation in sending us address changes for your parishioners. The post office charges *The Register* 59 cents each time one cannot be delivered, and because they aren't particularly prompt in returning those to us, sometimes we are charged for two or three undeliverable issues before we are aware of the situation. If we have not received an address change, the mailing is immediately stopped until we are advised of a new address. Prompt notification by your office helps us avoid stoppage of the newspaper to your parishioners and saves us the extra return postage.

The October SDNB will have several suggested paragraphs about *The Register* promotion for use in your bulletins during the last half of October and the first half of November. Thank you for your assistance.

Thou lovest them, and they do not love Thee; Thou dost confer benefits on them, and they return Thee insults; Thou wouldst have them hear Thy voice, and they will not listen; Thou dost offer them graces and they refuse them. Ah! my Jesus, I, too, was once among the number of these ungrateful souls. O my God, it is only too true. But I desire to amend, and I wish to compensate for the injuries I have done to Thee, by doing all I can to please Thee for the remainder of my life. Tell me, O Lord, what Thou dost require of me. I will do it without the least reserve. Make known to me Thy will by the way of holy obedience, and I hope to accomplish it. My God, I firmly promise never to leave undone any act which I know to be agreeable to Thee, although the performance of it should cost me the loss of all things--of relation, friends, character, health and even life itself. Let me lose all, if only I may do Thy will! Happy loss, when all is sacrificed to content Thy heart. O God of my soul! I love Thee, O Sovereign God, above all gods worthy of my love, and in loving I unite my feeble heart with the hearts of all the Seraphim. I unite it with the heart of Mary and with the heart of Jesus. I love Thee with my whole soul; I wish to love Thee alone, now and forever.

## Reflection

Our culture is obsessed with perfection—a superficial perfection. Photos are airbrushed, and social media sites depict seemingly perfect lives. God calls us to seek perfection, too. He does not call us, however, to perfection of appearance or abilities, but to perfection in love.

In "A Perfect Gift," one parent shares about the experience of raising a child with Down syndrome, contrasting it with what onlookers might perceive: "It's like looking at a stained-glass window from the outside: The colors look dark, and you can't quite make out the figures. From the inside, however, with the sun shining through it, the effect can be brilliant. From inside our family, love illuminates our life with Charlie.\* What may seem dreary to others, perhaps even unbearable, is actually filled with beauty and color." May each of us experience the power of God's transforming love, that our eyes may be opened to the incredible beauty of the people the Lord places in our lives.

## Acts of Reparation (choose one)

- Say a prayer for your parish priest (www.goo.gl/jqOiNS). Without our priests, we could not have the Mass or the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
- Pray for your deceased relatives and those who have no one to pray for them.
- Spend quality time with a family member or friend; offer to help them with something with which they need assistance.

## One Step Further

Charlie's mother shares in "A Perfect Gift" that when people say, "I could never handle a child with a disability," she explains to them, "[Y]ou aren't given *a* child with a disability. You are given *your* child with a disability. ...You are not called to 'handle' a disability. You are called to love a particular person, and caring for him or her grows out of that love. ...Our [family's] hearts...have become larger [by caring for Charlie]."

### ALL SAINTS Day—November 1

SIMPLE STEPS FOR "HOME MADE" SAINTS:

- 1. A **Prayerful Spirit**: develop a habit of prayer—before meals and bedtime, before soccer games and recitals, when sick or anxious about something, when saying good-bye, when there is a loss, a victory, hurt feelings or happy occasions. Make all kinds of prayer a part of family living: spontaneous, memorized, from books or tapes, out loud, quietly to self, together, alone.
- 2. A Spirit of Love: Saints are experts at loving the way Jesus did: in ordinary human events like listening patiently to siblings, correcting children gently, cooking and cleaning faithfully, respecting differences in each other, sacrificing one's own desires for the good of another, setting and enforcing limits for children, visiting elderly relatives . . . . All these family actions, done in a spirit of love, are holy!
- 3. **Readiness to Forgive**: The ability to forgive injuries and hurts, however difficult, is a sure sign of holiness! We're on our way to sainthood when we forgive our spouse or children, reconcile with a brother or sister, uncle or aunt, continue to stay in touch with those who have hurt us, invite relatives to family gatherings even though they do not reciprocate.
- 4. A Strong Sense of Justice: Parenting is saint-making. Saints are people who probably learned early in life to take turns, share resources, respect others' rights and their property, resolve conflict peacefully, do their share of work for the common good. All these things are part of good parenting skills.
- 5. Fidelity to Commitment: At home, we may never be martyred or suffer persecution for Christ's sake, but when we are faithful in everyday ways to spouse, children and parents, we are signs of God's faithfulness to them ... and that's holy.
- 6. A Spirit of Peace and Joy: Someone once said, "Joy is the echo of God's life in us." Saints are people filled with joy and peace wherever they are: in kitchens doing dishes, in cars driving to school, in dark bedrooms comforting fears, on front porches welcoming family home!
- 7. A Spirit of Service and Compassion: Saints not only love God a lot, they *show it* in compassion and service of others. Saint-making at home happens whenever we listen with care to the frustrations and hurts of family members, labor long hours to prepare for a birthday celebration, call family members together to help with parish or community service projects, or give money and time to earthquake victims.

Taken from Faith and Fest © 2004 The Catholic Archdiocese of Omaha In addition to dressing up in costume and begging for candy door to door, the following are some ways to celebrate the Christian meaning of All Hallows Eve, the next day, which is All Saints Day, and the following day, the Feast of All Souls:

#### Saints Costumes

On the eve of All Saints, consider dressing children in saint's costumes and giving a portion of whatever goodies are collected to the poor. Or trick or treat for UNICEF.

#### **Patron Saint Information**

In preparation for All Saints Day, help each child find information about his/her name saint—or a favorite saint. Each family member can decorate a placemat or poster with the saint's name and a simple drawing (or cut-out pictures) to represent that saint.

#### **Patron Saint Sharing**

On All Saints Day, give each member of the family a picture, book or symbol of his/her name saint. Give each one an opportunity to tell the family what is important about the patron saint. Parents may wish to explain why names were chosen or tell stories about ancestors who had these names before them. Do this around a special meal or at bedtime.

#### Prayer

On All Souls Day, make a visit to church to pray for all your loved ones who have died. Talk about what part of those persons lives on in family traditions and memories (like Grandma's pie recipe or Uncle Pete's funny stories).

#### **Cemetery Visit**

Visit the cemetery to pray at the graves of family and friends. Talk openly about death with children. Explain to children about the new life after death. If you have forgotten or do not know about the "communion of saints," look up some information about it to share with family, emphasizing the ongoing relationship with those who have gone before us.

#### Decorations

Decorate your home with pictures and memorabilia of relatives and friends who have died. Make All Souls day a happy day of celebration and remembrance. Line up pictures on the mantle or kitchen shelf and leave them out long enough to show neighbors and friends.

#### **Begin Healing**

If there is a recent death in your family, take the opportunity on All Souls Day to talk with a friend or counselor about unresolved fears or feelings of loss. Purchase a good book or seek out a program that deals with the grief process. Mark this day as the beginning of your efforts to heal the loss.

  - Side 2: For Stephen, the first martyr, and all the martyrs and saints in every age and in every land,
  - Side 1: For the holy men and women in our family who have been examples of faith for us.
- All: In Your mercy, O Lord our God, give us, as You gave to them, the hope of salvation and the promise of eternal life; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the first born of many from the dead. Amen.

## MARRIAGE PREPARATION

**FOCCUS**—The FOCCUS Inventory is designed to help engaged couples appreciate their unique relationship, learn more about themselves, and discuss topics important to their lifelong marriage. It is essential to promote healthy, happy, permanent relationships. It help couples enhance their relationship by discussing important topics including communication, problemsolving, religion, dual careers, parenting, intimacy, finances and more.

**ENGAGED ENCOUNTER**—Engaged Encounter is a retreat for engaged couples to get away from the daily grind and take time to truly focus on each other and the life they are starting together. A couple that comes into the weekend with an open mind and heart will get the chance to further deepen their relationship in a meaningful and real way without outside input or distraction. The couple will have quality time to focus on each other and discuss ambitions, goals, attitudes about God, sex, money, children, family, and their role in the church and community.

**CATHOLICMARRIAGEPREP.COM**—A one-on-one online mentor program taught by a married instructor couple. The program covers the theological and sacramental aspects of marriage and sexuality and expands on the life-skills couples will need throughout their marriage. It has been especially useful for couples with irregular schedules or those separated by distance during their engagement. Online worksheets foster conversation between the couple, and are followed up with personalized feedback from their instructor mentor couple.

**GOD'S PLAN FOR A JOY-FILLED MARRIAGE**—A 6-Part study based on Blessed John Paul II's Theology of the Body. The program is a key component of marriage preparation, catechesis in the theology of marriage and the gift of human sexuality. It provides couples with a rich understanding of the teaching of the Church and offers them the tools to live them out in married life. When engaged couples understand God's plan for marriage—including a clear and pastoral explanation of the "difficult teachings"—they come away with a sense of liberation and gratitude toward the Church.

**LIVING A JOY-FILLED MARRIAGE**—A virtue based, life-skills marriage preparation program designed to help engaged/married couples set patterns of thought and behavior that will ensure a lifelong, joy-filled marriage. This program can be used with God's Plan For A Joy-Filled Marriage for a complete marriage preparation offering or each can be used individually. A three stage approach is incorporated in this program: Learning, Discuss & Discover and Plan & Build. It springs from the teachings of Blessed John Paul II's message to families and couples to seek their identity and mission in Christ's call to Love.

**NATURAL FAMILY PLANNING**—NFP is an opportunity for couples to learn about their natural signs of fertility to plan or postpone pregnancy without using drugs or mechanical devices. It is a way to help couples who have experienced infertility as well as couples who have normal fertility. It is highly reliable, medically safe and easy to learn. NFP is morally acceptable in all major religions as a responsible means to postpone pregnancy and regulate family size. It promotes intimacy, protects new life and is helpful to couples who experience infertility by identifying and treating many reproductive health problems.
