1. **The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception** in 2018 is celebrated on Saturday, December 8. As the Patronal Feast day of the United States, the solemnity is always a holy day of obligation. The obligation is fulfilled by attending the vigil Mass on Friday evening, December 7, or Mass during the day on Saturday morning.

In the Table of Liturgical Days, a solemnity of the Virgin Mary ranks lower than a Sunday in Advent; therefore, the Immaculate Conception will end on the afternoon of Saturday, December 8. On Saturday evening, Evening Prayer I of the Second Sunday of Advent is celebrated instead of Evening Prayer II of the Immaculate Conception, and Masses are that of the Second Sunday of Advent.

ON-SITE VISITS: In January of 2017, the Office of Safety and Security began making On-Site Visits to Parishes and Schools. The three-year cycle was made to cover all Parishes and Schools in the Diocese. Year 1 (2017) visits consisted of all Parishes and Schools in the Western Deanery plus those in Manhattan, Ogden and Junction City. Year 2 (2018) visits consisted of those in the East Central Deanery plus the remainder of the East Deanery. Year 3 (2019) visits will consist of those in the West Central Deanery, plus any remaining parishes/schools that we did not visit in 2017 or 2018. #iGiveCatholic - A COUPLE REMINDERS AND TIPS

An email was sent from Beth to all parishes, schools and organizations late in September. It was full of tips, training opportunities and resources available to help you complete your profile and begin promoting your participation in #iGiveCatholic. If you did not receive that email, it's likely we have the wrong email address for you. Contact Beth at beth.shearer@salinadiocese.org. Here are a couple key points from that email.

Set up your profile – Your profile needs to be completed by October 31, 2018. Everyone should have received an email from GiveGab on August 16 with sign up information. Go to that email and get signed up. If you have any problems, just use the blue chat button.

Matching funds are available – the diocese has several donors who established a pool of matching funds. So every gift to our diocese thru #iGiveCatholic can be matched \$1 for \$1, up to the amount in the pool. There will be a \$1,000 maximum per donor. At this point the pool is \$50,000. But you will need to be signed up by October 31 to participate.

Training and resources are available on the #iGiveCatholic website https://salina.igivecatholic.org/ Check under the menu button for either section, Resources or Training.

Promote your participation in #iGiveCatholic. The Salina diocese has items available, specific to our diocese, to help you promote this giving opportunity.





Bishop Vincke refers to the clergy sexual abuse scandal as a "Time for Healing". Bishop Vincke says it is completely understandable to have feelings of frustration, anger and confusion. The church scandal is weighing on all of us, and when one suffers, we all suffer. As our new Shepherd, "I will do all I can to make sure we do things the right way. I will have to gain your trust. I will give my life to you. The Lord has chosen me to to be your Shepherd during this difficult time in the church. Pray for me. This might be a long process, however we put our trust in the Lord who will bring a greater good out of this than we can ever imagine".

As a community of faith let us pray for God's wisdom and strength for renewal. Here are some practical suggestions offered by Bishop Vincke:

For your parishes:

- · Add a petition to the general intercessions at Mass for the healing of all Victims and for the Church.
 - · Offer Mass for the Forgiveness of Sins whenever possible.
 - · Gather parishioners for the Rosary and the Divine Mercy Chaplet.

For ourselves:

- · Fast one day a week as a sign of repentance.
- · Spend more time in prayer. It's a time for listening to Jesus and discerning His will.

This resource from Healing Voices is a good outline of how to make an impact with the "people in the pews" along with survivors. Founders of the Healing Voices magazine offer these suggestions for action that can have immediate impact in a parish or group, in homes with friends, or alone in the company of all the angels and saints.

Pinwheel event – Prayer Service Mass for Hope and Healing Adoration – Rosaries – Novenas – Discussion Groups Peace Circles – Sacred Places Catholic Media – Learning Sessions
