ON-SITE VISITS: In January of 2017, the Office of Safety and Security began making On-Site Visits to Parishes and Schools. Religious Education & Youth Ministry

Dear Coordinators of Religious Education, and Youth Ministers,

Greetings as we prepare for another change of seasons. I know that we will all welcome the cooler weather. This is also the time most parishes begin to prepare for another year of ministry.

I hope your Summer gave you some time to be with family and to catch up on some reading and just relaxing.

Jesus' message is lived and passed on in his Church. Catechists are part of that living continuity with the Gospel. And it is the Church's message that we proclaim. The importance of the ministry of catechesis is found in the role it has , in the name of and on behalf of the Church in bringing people to Christ. We are so fortunate in our diocese to have such dedicated and faith filled catechists and youth leaders who consistently give of themselves to share their faith and love of Jesus Christ with the young people in our parishes.

They both wanted to experience this week with their son/daughter because they heard so much about this experience from them.

A tremendous evangelizing opportunity lies directly before us with these parents. We, catechetical leaders and youth leaders, need to be desirous of inviting our parents to a conversion to Jesus and meaningful participation to Catholic life. We must recognize the fact that it means that we need to evangelize our households, not just the children. Are you ready to do this?

I also feel that if we are not touching hearts in our formation today, we are wasting our time. If we are not heavily focusing our efforts on PARENTS (in an evangelizing way) we are failing as parishes and as leaders.

May God bless your efforts to develop both parent and family formation that is designed to open hearts and invite people into a renewed (or new) Catholic life in Jesus Christ. It is at the heart of new evangelization, indeed the very mission of the church, that we are all called to passionately serve today.

Let us make PARENTS and FAMILY a priority in our diocese this coming year.

Catechetical Sunday

CATECHETICAL SUNDAY

This year the Church will celebrate Catechetical Sunday on September 16, 2018. The theme will be "Enlisting Witnesses for Jesus Christ." Those who the Community has designated to serve as catechists will be called forth to be commissioned for their ministry. Catechetical Sunday is a wonderful opportunity to reflect on the role that each person plays, by virtue of Baptism, in handing on the faith and being a witness to the Gospel. Catechetical Sunday is an opportunity for all to rededicate themselves to this mission as a community of faith. The ministry of teaching in the name of the Church has a profound dignity which is why catechists are formally commissioned by the Church. It is only fitting that we set aside a day to highlight this ministry and invite the entire church community to think about our responsibility to share our faith with others.

We are living in a secularized society which continues to squeeze Christianity to the margins, or completely out of engagement with Jesus Christ and the Church.

We are losing baptized Catholics at an alarming rate. According to Pew Research, nearly one-in-four adults (24%) are now former Catholics and most of them are "Nones", a term used for people with no religious affiliation.


Many parents are saddened to report that their children are leaving the Church after preparing for and celebrating initiation sacraments, and after years of Catholic School or parish religious education classes. Figures for Baptisms, Church weddings and weekly Mass attendance are down. Those who self-identify as atheists or agnostics ("Nones") now make up roughly 23% of the U.S. adult population.

Parents are truly the primary catechists of their children. They prepare the soil and plant the first seeds of faith. On Catechetical Sunday, we not only highlight the work of catechists in parishes and schools, but we also commend parents and guardians and encourage them to take seriously their role of making their Catholic households a place where faith is passed on to the next generation. This is why the rite of blessing of catechists used on Catechetical Sunday includes an optional blessing of parents and quardians.

During 2019, we will focus particularly on the steps needed to enable the faithful to claim their true roles as witnesses to Jesus Christ. In imitation of Jesus' encounter with two disciples on the road to Emmaus (Luke 24:13-35), we will become more familiar with terms like "accompanying", "evangelizing", and "catechizing". We will learn how to assist folks in exploring the reasonableness of the Faith, having an "encounter" with Jesus, sharing in a deeper faith experience, and drawing out the meaning of those experiences for their lives. May the joy of our life in Christ be so remarkable that even the "Nones" are moved to ask what is the secret behind this joy and claim it for themselves.

However, it can also be given to those who are still alive and/or living on their own or in their children's home. What a great tradition to start with your grandparents!

When our son or daughter becomes a parent, something marvelous happens to us. We become grandparents! The ancient blessing from Psalm 128:5-6 is fulfilled for us:

"May you live to see your children's children."

A new life wraps itself around our hearts, our eyes fill with tears of joy, and we are blessed in a most amazing way!

Although parents are the most important teachers in a child's life, grandparents also have a role to play.

Pope Francis tells us in Amoris Laetitia ("The Joy of Love"): "Very often it is grandparents who ensure that the most important values are passed down to their grandchildren, and many people can testify that they owe their initiation into the Christian life to their grandparents. How will leave that spiritual legacy with your grandchildren?
