### **OFFICE OF RESPECT LIFE**

**2021 MARCH FOR LIFE in TOPEKA** is set for Thursday, January 21<sup>st</sup>. Because of the pandemic, there are still many details of the event to be decided. The IGNITE rally and Mass normally held are facing the possibility of severely reduced numbers. Efforts are being made to have the restrictions on gatherings be waived for this event. It is possible there will even be restrictions placed on outside gatherings. It is more important than ever for us to have a physical presence advocating for those that have no voice. Please prayerfully consider organizing a delegation from your parish to attend the March for Life in Topeka. **2021 MARCH FOR LIFE in D.C.** will be held Friday, January 29<sup>th</sup>. We currently have 75 people planning on making the pilgrimage to D.C.! With courage and fortitude, the participants have overcome many obstacles in arranging plans to participate in the pilgrimage to defend life from conception to natural death. Parishes are encouraged to plan Holy Hours or prayer services on either January 22<sup>nd</sup>, (the day Roe v. Wade became law) or on January 29<sup>th</sup>, (the day of the National March). Other possibilities include a peaceful march from your parish to the local courthouse or government offices.

#### **OFFICE OF FAMILY LIFE**

**NATIONAL MARRIAGE WEEK-USA and WORLD MARRIAGE SUNDAY:** National marriage week is slated for **Feb.** 7<sup>th</sup> - 14<sup>th</sup> and culminates with **World Marriage Sunday, Feb.** 14<sup>th</sup>. Because of the pandemic, the diocese does not have any events scheduled, but encourages parishes to do something on the local level to recognize the sanctity of marriage. This is an opportunity to spread the news that marriage, as a Sacrament instituted by Christ, has many values beyond the obvious. Research shows that marriage adds years to your life as married couples live 2-10 years longer than singles. Statistically, married couples are healthier, both physically and mentally, and are less likely to develop mental problems, such as depression. Married people recover more positively from surgery and injury and even sleep better. Married couples tend to act more responsibly in avoiding risky behavior as they want to stay alive and well for their spouse and children. Researchers agree marriage has demonstrable benefits for children that grow up in a healthy marriage and for society in general. For more information, click <u>HERE</u>.

I can help answer any questions about how to proceed on putting together paperwork for the Tribunal – whether it's associated with an RCIA student or not.

Sometimes, a couple is in a civil union and simply needs a marriage ceremony in the Church. If you are unsure if that would be necessary for a given couple, you can contact me. Do we require marriage prep for such couples? While it is understandable to modify their marriage preparation process, I invite you to see this as an evangelization opportunity. The couple may need you to help address some brokenness and communication strategies while also teaching them the good news about God's design for marriage. We do our best to cater to their needs – so that we don't overwhelm them, but also that we don't take the sacrament lightly.

#### **Safety Coordinators:**

As we begin a new calendar year, we want to take this opportunity to thank you for all the work you do in the Diocese of Salina, and share with you a letter Bishop Vincke received from Stone Bridge Partners this fall. This letter represents true commitment and dedication to the Charter; promise to protect, pledge to heal. We sincerely thank you for your ministry as you faithfully implement the Safe Environment Program in your parishes and schools. Sometime in 2021 the Safe Environment Office is scheduled for an on-site audit through Stone Bridge Partners. Please continue to be vigilant and attentive to the efforts of protecting children and maintaining safe environments so our children can learn, pray and grow.

Dear Bishop Vincke:

We are writing to inform you that the Diocese of Salina is in compliance with the data collection requirements for the 2019/2020 Charter audit period.
