## PLEDGE TO HEAL

As a community of faith, we believe that the prevention of child abuse begins with each person. Increased awareness and willingness to take action are steps for every person to take to suppress abuse in our parishes, in our schools, in our communities, and in our families.



#### THE CATHOLIC DIOCESE OF SALINA

Our diocese is committed to maintaining safe environments for children to learn, pray and grow. The Safe Environment Office supports our parishes and schools and maintains compliance of our diocese through our Safe Environment Program. All clergy and seminarians; all employees of the diocese; and schools and entities associated with the diocese; and all volunteers with regard to their contact with minors, must complete safe environment training. Along with adults, students enrolled in parish religious education programs and Catholic Schools will also participate in age appropriate safe environment training.

#### TRAINING PROGRAM FOR ADULTS

Adults will complete safe environment training through CMGConnect's on-line training platform. This training includes information regarding the nature of child abuse, how it is perpetrated, how to report, strategies for prevention, and a review of the diocesan policy and code of conduct.

#### **CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECK**

Adults must pass a criminal background check through Selection.com This background check is integrated through the CMGConnect portal. This check must be completed before you may begin employment, or volunteer with minors. This check must be renewed every five (5) years.

#### TRAINING PROGRAM FOR STUDENTS

The Diocese of Salina incorporates into the teaching curriculum in both schools and parishes, safe environment training for students in grades K-12. These lessons include information and instruction about God's love, relationships, personal space, boundaries, respect, lures, bullying, internet safety, as well as how to get help from a trusted adult.

### **THE CHARTER**

Since 2002, the bishops of the United States have carried out their ministries to protect and heal in all dioceses through the implementation of the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People.

The Charter directs action on the following matters: Outreach and healing to victims and survivors; prompt and effective responses to allegations of abuse; cooperation with public authorities; removal of offenders from ministry; safe environment training programs for clergy, employees, volunteers and children; background checks for all clergy, employees, and volunteers with regard to their contact with children, and an annual audit of diocese to ensure compliance with Charter guidelines.



### **WE ARE CALLED**

The Church's mission to protect and heal stems from the Gospel: the life and teaching of Jesus Christ provide us with the perfect foundation for our efforts to create safe environments for children.

Here some ways you can help keep children safe:

- Develop appropriate and loving relationships with your children.
- Teach your children safe and healthy boundaries.
- Know who has access to your children.
- Learn the warning signs of abuse.
- Report abuse to appropriate authorities.
