OFFICE OF THE CHANCELLOR

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS can sometimes be overlooked at the parish level. Recently, a series of strange letters from the same person were left at or delivered to parishes in the western part of the diocese. The incidents were reported to local, state and national authorities due to the nature of the letters and the individual's unusual behavior with parish staff. While there does not appear to be any immediate danger, the current political, economic and social environment on top of recent weather-related emergency events give good reason to review your parish and/or school emergency preparedness plans.

PARISH PASTORAL AND FINANCE COUNCILS are an important part of a successful and thriving parish. Each Parish Council and Finance Council should have its own constitution and bylaws appropriate for the community they serve. The Diocesan Policy Handbook may be used as a guide in creating or updating your constitutions and bylaws but cannot serve in their place. The Parish Pastoral Council is under the leadership of the Pastor who should preside over it. Its purpose is to assist in the pastoral activities of the parish. The Parish Finance Council is a requirement of Canon Law and assists the pastor in the administration of the goods of the parish with the understanding that the pastor represents the parish. In many of our small communities, the Parish Pastoral Council and the Parish Finance Council consist of the same individuals. If this is the case, it should be specifically stated in the constitutions and bylaws created that jointly serve both the Parish Pastoral Council and Finance Council. If you have not recently reviewed or updated the constitutions and bylaws of these councils in your parish, please consider doing so.

OFFICE OF RURAL LIFE

ST. ISIDORE'S DAY, May 15, will be in the East Deanery. St. John the Baptist Parish in Hanover will host the 2022 St. Isidore's Day observance for the Diocese of Salina. Since May 15th is a Sunday, the observance will be on Monday, May 16th. St. Isidore's Day is observed with visits to rural agriculture business, farms or institutions. In addition, we have blessings of the flocks and fields. Mass is offered, usually with the bishop officiating, followed by a dinner for participants. This includes certification status forms, children's data report form and bulletin announcements. It is imperative that this information be on file and up-to-date to maintain compliance in your parishes and schools in the diocese. Please review the Safe Environment Program Handbook or contact the Safe Environment Office if you have questions.

APRIL IS CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION MONTH - a time to act collectively to raise awareness and empower people across our diocese to play a role in making great childhoods happen. Last year, on April 23rd, to raise awareness here at the Chancery, the staff all wore blue, as wearing blue connects you with millions of others who support child abuse prevention efforts. Along with wearing blue, the Chancery staff was also able to select promotional items and prayer cards from the "expo table" which was set up in the breakroom. IMMIGRATION - Sometimes, Catholic Charities is mentioned in national news in connection with immigration issues, which can spark many questions about our services. Here is our response: At Catholic Charities of Northern Kansas, which serves the 31 counties of the Salina Diocese, our immigration department's mission is to assist immigrants in obtaining and maintaining their legal status in the United States. Our team works with an immigration attorney to provide affordable services to these folks so that cost is not a barrier to them in obtaining legal status, as many private immigration attorneys are very expensive.

All dollars donated to Catholic Charities of Northern Kansas remain in our diocese to support the mission of our local organization. We take direction from a local board of directors, including Bishop Vincke. What you may see happening nationally or on the news is not directly connected to our specific agency.

At the end of the day, as Catholics, our mission is to serve all humans who are made in the image and likeness of God. We strive every day, as Jesus taught, to help others improve their lives by feeding the hungry, clothing the naked, sheltering the homeless and welcoming our neighbor. We are always happy to help answer questions about immigration and our other services!
