DAY OF PRAYER IN ATONEMENT FOR THOSE HARMED BY SEXUAL ABUSE:

Together with the Archdiocese of Kansas City in Kansas, and the Diocese of Kansas City – St. Joseph, we will recognize April 26, 2024, as a Day of Prayer in Day of Prayer in Atonement of and for the Healing of All Those Harmed by Sexual Abuse. It is recommended that all daily Masses offered that day employ the Mass formula "For Reconciliation" (Number 16 of Masses and Prayers for Various Needs and Occasions). Readings may be those for the day (Friday of the Fourth Week of Easter) or from those listed "For Reconciliation" (found in Volume IV of the Lectionary for Mass). It is especially fitting that one of the Eucharistic Prayers for Reconciliation be used during the Mass. The petitions of the Universal Prayer should include prayers for atonement for any grave harm caused by members of the Church as well as for the healing of those who have suffered and continue to suffer because of past sexual abuse.

OFFICE OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

MICROSOFT has announced they will be ending support for Microsoft Publisher in October 2026. While that is more than two years away, it is not too early to start looking at how this will affect your parishes and offices. I know that many parishes use the Publisher program to produce their weekly bulletins or may use a printing service that requires the bulletin to be in Publisher format.

If you use a printing service, I recommend that you reach out to them to see what format they might start using. If you print your own bulletins, you might start thinking about using Microsoft Word or Google Docs. Both of those programs will allow you to save your bulletin in PDF format. The way you create items in those programs will be a little different but should be easy to learn with some practice. If you are apprehensive about using a new program, there are many great tutorial videos on YouTube that are very thorough in explaining how to do things.

TAX CREDIT SCHOLARSHIP: The Scholarship Granting Fund for the Catholic Diocese of Salina is accepting donations and is able to offer a 75% tax credit. Please email Katie Platten, CEO for Catholic Foundation katie.platten@salinadiocese.org. This school year, over \$119,000 was awarded to schools for 96 students in the Salina Diocese.

RELIGION ASSESSMENT: This year, schools and parishes are participating in the ARK (Assessment of Religious Knowledge). The ARK will be given to students in grades 2-12 in late April and early May. We are excited to see the results and celebrate the areas we are performing well in and target areas for growth in the future.

FIELD TRIPS: The spring is full of field trips for many of our students. Visiting places across the state with classmates is a great learning experience. Whether it is a trip to a local zoo or to the salt mines, students remember these days very well! We even have one group that visits the Chancery for a tour!

ACTIVITIES: The Catholic High Schools of the Salina Diocese capped off the Winter Activities season and faired quite well. Multiple schools competed at the State Scholar's Bowl and State Basketball Tournament, and we had individuals compete at State Wrestling and State Bowling.

ITALY PILGRIMAGE 2025: Superintendent Geoff Andrews is planning a pilgrimage to Italy in June 2025 in coordination with the Jubilee Year. Students from the five Catholic high schools in the diocese in the graduating classes of 2026 and 2027 along with their families are eligible to sign up. For more info visit the website.

KANSAS STATE ASSESSMENTS: Students will be taking the State Assessments in the spring. Students are scored on a scale from 1-4, with 4 being the highest score. Our goal is to increase the <u>number</u> of students scoring in level 3 and 4. Below is a breakdown of the Salina Diocese compared to the rest of the State of Kansas. We are doing well when compared to the rest, however, we know there is always room for improvement for achievement. This year, we introduced the Bishop's Star Award for students who received a score of 3 or 4 on the State Assessments.


















Sacred Heart Parish, Oberlin, KS






