SAFETY COORDINATORS - Please continue to monitor your CMGConnect database through the summer months, especially if your parish or school continues to have summer programs for our youth. Please archive users who are not ministering and contact users who need to update. Continuing this process during the summer will make "paperwork" easier this fall. Please ensure drivers transporting minors during summer programs follow diocesan guidelines. Please refer to the Field Trip Supplement of the Safe Environment Program Handbook for detailed instructions. If you have any questions related to Safe Environment Training and background checks, or any other concerns in regard to safety, please email wendy.backes@salinadiocese.org. Additionally, please continue to check your email for other important information from the Safe Environment Office during the summer months.

Frequently Asked Questions

1. What is MHSF?

The *Missionaries of the Holy Spirit in the Family* (MHSF) is a Catholic apostolate for married couples which is built up around the practical application of the New Evangelization in the Domestic Church to build up the culture of marriage & family.

It is our vision to unify, strengthen, and normalize virtuous marriages that are solidified by orthodox formation, an intentional community, and deep encounter with God.

2. What is the purpose of MHSF?

A primary goal of MHSF is to help married couples grow intentionally together strengthened by the graces of the Sacrament of Marriage. We provide a transformative environment through orthodox formation & community with other couples that fosters a depth of growth and vulnerability in married life through the Holy Spirit.

We create a roadmap for the family and a model of the tools needed to create a new normal in marriage and family life for the home, the community, and the culture at large. We take an “up and out” approach through a gradual process of apostolic multiplication unique to each family and specific to each person.

3. How can I join?

- a. Being a part of MHSF comes by joining (or starting) a local “chapter”. These chapters include couples (usually about 8 to 15) from your parish or community who come together on a monthly basis in being formed through the same four pillars of seminary formation: human, intellectual, spiritual, and apostolic.

4. How do I bring MHSF to my parish or community?
 - a. There are two simple ways to have MHSF brought to your community or parish:
 - A) Work with us to help start a chapter in your community or parish. Chapters begin at the beginning of each new year (i.e. January) and include a period of training to start a new chapter and a period of discernment for couples considering joining.
 - B) Share MHSF with your pastor or a priest who may be interested in learning more. Have them reach out to us directly for more details.
5. What does the commitment involve?
 - a. Couples who join MHSF spend two years together meeting monthly and participating in various gatherings, retreats, and small group activities.
6. Can I join if I am engaged?
 - a. MHSF is post-marriage formation aimed at those who are already married, so it is not for couples who are engaged. But once, married, we would love to have you!

Frequently Asked Questions (*for Priests*)

1. What is MHSF?
 - a. The *Missionaries of the Holy Spirit in the Family* (MHSF) is a Catholic apostolate for married couples which is built up around the practical application of the New Evangelization in the Domestic Church to build up the culture of marriage & family.
 - b. It is our vision to unify, strengthen, and normalize virtuous marriages that are solidified by orthodox formation, an intentional community, and deep encounter with God.
2. What is the involvement of a priest with this mission?
 - a. Please see below for details of an MHSF chapter, but generally speaking, a priest is needed to provide Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and offer the Sacrament of Confession for MHSF couples once per month.
3. Is there any benefit to my parish?
 - a. The Latin word 'seminary' means greenhouse. A greenhouse provides a place of protection for a seedling. Within the walls of the greenhouse, through proper nourishment, nurturing and light, it grows deep roots and begins to become what it truly is. As it becomes strong, it can be transplanted outside and will be able to withstand the storms of life. MHSF is a seminary for those in the Sacrament of Marriage.
 - b. Through human, spiritual, intellectual, and apostolic formation, spouses receive the wisdom and beauty that God has revealed about marriage. Through meaningful relationships with other couples, they realize it is normal to receive God's plan for marriage and family and so be fully alive. As St. John Paul II was fond of saying, "Family, become what you are."
 - c. In all likelihood, by families participating in MHSF formation, you are helping build, grow, and establish intentional disciples in your parish.

4. What does the process of starting an MHSF chapter look like?
 - a. We start MHSF Chapters annually, and they meet monthly for 24 sessions/months. They typically will meet at a local parish so that adoration and confession can be offered.
 - b. Prior to the commencement of each chapter, there is a short period of training to start a new chapter and a period of discernment for couples considering joining, typically during the Fall prior to a chapter starting.

An MHSF Chapter will include:

1. Somewhere between 8 and 15 couples. Typically any more than this, and we will look to create a second chapter to help foster intimacy, vulnerability, and friendship within the chapters
2. One "Facilitating Couple", whom we are able to communicate with and filter information through over the two year formation.
3. At least one priest who is able to offer adoration and confessions monthly. Preferably this priest will be able to be with the couples over the full two years, but obviously things can change but we want to try and plan for that if possible.
4. A "teacher" of the content. This could be the priest, someone local who can speak to the content, or at a minimum, our video series, that we created to facilitate this in the absence of an in-person teacher.

I am a priest for the Diocese of Lincoln in Nebraska. I am now stationed at St. Gregory the Great Seminary as the Director of the Propaedeutic Year. It has been a joy to meet with couples once a month on Friday evenings and pass along the formation. MHSF continues to work to make it easier and easier for a priest to impart the curriculum. Each month there are recommended Catholic teachings on the Sacrament of Marriage, spousal prayer, charisms, etc. from a variety of sources. Accompanying these teachings each month is a video and a section of the workbook. If a priest is pressed for time in preparing, they can press play on the video and afterward go through the discussion questions in the workbook with minimal prep-time. A priest can also look at the information beforehand and use it to tailor a personalized talk on the topic and form their own discussion questions with the couples.

What I have enjoyed most is to see the couples form deep friendships with other like-minded couples, and to enter into deeper friendships with them myself. The couples receive a new awareness that they are not trying to be faithful Catholic spouses and parents on their own, but they are making this journey with many other couples who desire to do the same. It has given me tremendous life in my own priesthood as I am invited in deeper ways into the family life of many of these couples. It's fun just to share a meal with them once a month as we have lighthearted discussions, and then to be able to be a spiritual father to them through the offering of Adoration and Confession.
