COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIPS - Great news for students in the Diocese of Salina! There are three scholarship opportunities available for the 2025-2026 school year. The application process is online and opened on Nov. 1, 2024. Students are encouraged to apply by March 1st, 2025, at givecfds.org/scholarships.

- **Monsignor Clement A. Kruse Scholarship** Applicant must be an active registered member of a Catholic parish in the Diocese of Salina. These scholarships are approximately \$500.
- **Marymount Memorial Educational Trust Scholarship** Applicant must be attending an accredited Catholic College as a full-time student and an active registered member of a Catholic parish in the Diocese of Salina. These scholarships vary but ranged from \$1,000-\$3,000.
- Susie Deges Scholarship This scholarship is specifically for high school seniors in the diocese who are active in their local CYO (Catholic Youth Organization). This scholarship is \$1,000.

ONETABLE - Through the One Table Initiative, the National Federation for Catholic Youth Ministry (NFCYM) intends to fulfill our commitment to building the domestic church. We hope to unify the parish church's ministry with the domestic church's ministry through moments of encounter, intentional dialogue, and mutual support and collaboration.

Seeing the changing cultural landscape that families are facing today, the OneTable Initiative aims to support the domestic church using a 3-pronged approach: training for parish leaders in synodal listening and strategic planning for ministries with families, direct marketing to parents to inspire them to engage their parish leaders in supporting parents in their domestic church and seeking dialogue with and the support of US Catholic bishops through a Champion Bishop and Bishop Advisory Council.

The OneTable Initiative has two overarching goals:

1. Inspiring, equipping, and empowering parents to form their children's faith in partnership with church leaders and ministers.

2. Inspiring, equipping, and empowering church leaders and ministers to partner with parents and caregivers in forming the faith of children.

Becoming App Savvy – What is Your Child Actually Viewing?

Forty-five years ago when the first cell phone call was made, who would have imagined that a small computer would now be in the pockets of the majority of Americans? Staying connected to friends and family has never been easier. However, if your child has access to a phone or tablet, do you know who they are connected to on their social media sites?

Having a Phone/Tablet

Many parents are conflicted on the best time to provide a phone or tablet for their child. It's important to remember there is no rush and you must first understand how each child will be utilizing their phone or tablet. This will enable you to discuss the proper guidelines and restrictions with your child from the start before using their device. Below are a few basic guidelines for safe usage of a phone or tablet when beginning this process.

- Never post or trade personal pictures.
- Never reveal personal information (address, phone number, school name/location).
- Never agree to meet up in person with an individual met online.
- Never respond to a threatening email, post, or text.
- Always tell a parent or trusted adult about any communication that was inappropriate.

Popular Social Media Apps

As a parent, it is important to follow and know popular social media 'Apps', or applications, that your child could be downloading onto their phone or tablet. For many children, they do not know all of their followers on social media, as the more you have the more popular you can appear. This could make your child a target to become 'friends' with a complete stranger online.

There are several applications that children can download, where their posts will remain anonymous (Yik Yak, Ask.FM, Whisper, Omegle). The anonymity can lead to online bullying or your child viewing potentially explicit content. Other applications can share your GPS location if it is not manually turned off in the privacy settings (Snapchat, Blendr, Holla). This can lead to your child's personal information being taken unknowingly.

"Ghost Apps"

Many parents do not feel the need to regulate their child's activity as they feel it is something that their child would not partake in. However, there are "ghost apps" that can disguise personal information in plain sight. This could include photos, videos, text messages, or phone calls. Many of these "ghost apps" look like an ordinary application, however, they require a specific passcode to view the private files.

Parental Controls

As a parent, you can circumvent many of these situations from happening by monitoring your child's activity while they use their phone or tablet. Below are basic guidelines for parental supervision of children when they receive a phone or tablet.

- Monitor time spent on phone or tablet.
- Bookmark favorite websites for easy access.
- Review credit card and phone bills for unfamiliar charges. If your phone or tablet has a credit card on file to purchase applications, require verification before purchases.
- Set up any other parental controls on devices. <u>NOTE</u>: You can view the optional trainings titled "*How to Set-Up Parental Controls on iOS*" or "*How to Set-Up Parental Controls on Google Chromebook*" in the Optional Training section of the main dashboard.

With technology changing daily, it is important to stay informed and aware of what your child is accessing through their phone or tablet. There could be a new popular application designed tomorrow that displays similar dangers. If the proper parental controls are set up, your child would not even be able to download the application without your permission first.

It is important to remember that the danger does not lie in the 'App' itself, however, it stems from the abuse and misuse of individuals using these applications. Communicating with your child on how to properly use their phone or tablet is how your entire family can become savvy in how they stay connected with people, whether it is through 'Apps' or a regular phone call.
