THE RITES OF ELECTION ARE:

Hays, St. Nicholas of Myra, March 9, 3:00 p.m. Salina, Sacred Heart Cathedral March 16, 3:00 p.m.

Please send in the names and addresses and specify if they are Candidates or Catechumens (please use only these Titles). Please be sure the spellings are correct. Email the information to coady@stmmanhattan.com.

Please respond no later than Wednesday, March 5, for Hays and Wednesday, March 12, for Salina. Also indicate which location they will attend the Rite of Election.

If a person is completing Confirmation only, they do not go through the Rite of Election. If a youth is younger than age 7 the youth does not go through the Rite of Election. Please note on your list if any people are related and what that relationship is. The bishop will send a personal letter of invitation to each Candidate and Catechumen. The letter is available in English and Spanish. Please indicate if you want the letter sent in Spanish (or Spanish and English) to any individuals.

Thank you for sending the above information which will help the Liturgy Office plan these celebrations.

1. REMINDERS THAT MAY HELP as you prepare for the Rite of Election.

On the morning of the first Sunday of Lent, the parish should celebrate the PARISH CELEBRATION FOR SENDING CATECHUMENS FOR ELECTION AND CANDIDATES FOR RECOGNITION BY THE BISHOP, nos. 530-546 in the OCIA Ritual. Catechumens should sign the Book of Elect during that rite (see no. 539). Parishes whose Rite of Election is celebrated on the Second Sunday of Lent should celebrate the Rite of Sending on that day.

Bring your Book of Elect to the Diocesan Rite of Election. The names of the Elect will be read from this book and presented to the Bishop.

Instructions for the Rite:

A. The people in the procession are:

Catechumens and Candidates

Sponsors

RCIA Directors

Pastors

They should gather in the parish hall.

Family members and guests are not in the procession. They should go to the church before the ceremony begins.

- B. The front pews are reserved for the people in the procession.
- C. Catechumens/Candidates should sit on the left side of the church; Sponsors, Directors, and Pastors should sit on the right side of the church. Please try to arrange the Catechumens and Candidates in the order that they will be called by the RCIA Director so that the procession will flow smoothly.
- D. The RCIA Director comes to the ambo when the name of the parish is called. S/he calls out the names in this way:
 - "I present for baptism...(all those names)
 - "I present for full communion...(all those names)

The Catechumens and Candidates come to the front as the names are being called. They should all leave the pew immediately, not waiting for their names to be called (think liturgical procession rather than graduation ceremony). The Bishop will greet each one individually, after which they return to their seats. When the Director finishes reading the names, s/he gives the Book of Elect to the Bishop, who signs it.

- 2. Chrism Mass is April 10, 11:30 a.m., at the Cathedral.
- 3. The Easter Vigil, April 19, should not begin before 8:30 p.m.

Social Media & Child Safety

As the digital landscape continues to evolve, social media platforms have become an integral part of children's lives. While these platforms offer opportunities for connection and creativity, they also present potential risks. There are best practices to ensure the safety of children while navigating the complex world of social media, emphasizing the importance of education, communication, and proactive parental involvement.

Understanding the Risks

Children are exposed to various risks on social media, including cyberbullying, inappropriate content, online predators, and potential breaches of privacy. Acknowledging these risks is the first step towards implementing effective safety measures.

- Educate Children about Online Risks: Educating children about the potential
 dangers they might encounter on social media is paramount. Discuss
 cyberbullying, the importance of privacy settings, and the potential
 consequences of sharing personal information. Encourage them to think
 critically about the content they encounter and to report any concerning
 behavior.
- Set Age-Appropriate Boundaries: Most social media platforms have age restrictions for a reason. Enforce age-appropriate boundaries to ensure that children are using platforms that align with their developmental stage. Younger children may benefit from supervised platforms with additional safety features.
- Open Communication Channels: Establishing open communication with children is crucial. Encourage them to share their online experiences, ask questions, and express concerns without fear of punishment. This fosters trust and allows parents to address issues promptly.
- Teach Responsible Posting and Sharing: Instill a sense of responsibility regarding what children post and share online. Emphasize the permanence of digital content and the potential impact on their reputation. Encourage them to think twice before sharing personal information or engaging in risky online behavior.

Implementing Safety Measures

As a parent, you can prevent many of these situations from happening by monitoring your child's activity while they use their phone or tablet. Below are basic guidelines for parental supervision of children when they receive a phone or tablet.

- Privacy Settings: Teach children how to adjust privacy settings on their social media accounts. Restricting access to personal information and choosing who can see their posts helps control their online environment.
- Monitoring and Supervision: Regularly monitor children's online activities and when appropriate, supervise their usage. This proactive approach allows parents to identify potential risks and address concerns before they escalate.
- Use Parental Controls: Leverage parental control tools provided by social media platforms or third-party apps. These tools allow parents to set restrictions, monitor online activities, and receive alerts for suspicious behavior. NOTE: You can view the optional trainings titled "How to Set-Up Parental Controls on iOS" or "How to Set-Up Parental Controls on Google Chromebook" in the Optional Training section of the main dashboard.
- Encourage Positive Online Behavior: Promote positive online behavior by emphasizing the importance of respect and kindness. Teach children to think critically about the content they encounter and to be mindful of the impact of their words and actions on others.

Navigating the digital landscape can be challenging, but with proactive measures, education, and open communication, parents can create a safer online environment for their children. By instilling responsible online habits and staying actively involved in their digital lives, we can empower the younger generation to make informed choices and build positive, meaningful connections in the everexpanding world of social media.
