CARES FOR KIDS' MONTHLY NEWSLETTER - Attached please find the newsletter "The Silent Torment: Understanding the Impacts of Cyberbullying." Just because school is out for the summer, it does not mean taking a vacation from keeping kids safe. When many think of bullying, for example, we imagine a child getting picked on or teased at the playground. However, with the advances of technology, bullying tactics have changed. In the digital age, where screens mediate our interactions, a new form of bullying has emerged, leaving scars that are often unseen but deeply felt. This is called cyberbullying and can occur anywhere with an Internet connection. So, as we move into the summer months, please continue to be extra vigilant, while many kids will be on various devices, and may not always be under the supervision of a teacher or guardian. Please use this newsletter as an additional resource as you continue to provide safe environments in your parish and school communities. SUMMER COUNSELING SERVICES NOW AVAILABLE - Catholic Charities of Northern Kansas is excited to welcome Alli Puetz, a Master of Social Work (MSW) student at the University of Saint Mary, as a summer counseling intern serving the Manhattan community and beyond. Alli is now accepting new clients for in-person counseling in Manhattan and teletherapy sessions for individuals across the Diocese of Salina. She is available now through the end of July, with immediate openings for children (ages 10+), teens, adults, couples, and families. Alli will provide counseling services under the clinical supervision of Jessica Sampson, LSCSW, Director of Family Support Services at Catholic Charities. Jessica has more than 13 years of experience with the organization and is a licensed specialist in clinical social work. Counseling through Catholic Charities is available to all individuals regardless of religion, race, age, or financial status. Services are confidential and offered either in person at one of the agency's office locations or via teletherapy through a secure online platform, based on client preference. To schedule an appointment with Alli, please call the Manhattan office at 785-323-0644. Fees are based on a simple sliding scale of \$10, \$25, or \$50 per session, depending on household income. While Catholic Charities does not accept insurance, the organization is committed to ensuring that cost is never a barrier to care. The Silent Torment: Understanding the Impacts of Cyberbullying

When many think of bullying, they imagine a child getting picked on or teased at the playground. However, with the advances of technology, bullying tactics have changed. In the digital age, where screens mediate our interactions, a new form of bullying has emerged, leaving scars that are often unseen but deeply felt. This is cyberbullying and can occur anywhere with an Internet connection.

What is Cyberbullying?

Cyberbullying is a type of bullying that occurs over digital devices and usually refers to bullying among teenagers or children. The bully, or bullies, can use the devices to share negative, harmful, or false content with others. This can occur in any online setting, where common instances are through text messaging, social media, video/computer games, or other online forums. This form of bullying most frequently occurs among children who already know each other, where the victim is often getting bullied both at school and online.

Effects of Cyberbullying

The effects of cyberbullying are multifaceted and can have long-lasting consequences on mental health. Victims often experience increased levels of anxiety, depression, and feelings of loneliness. Other warning signs that cyberbullying is occurring are the victim may become hesitant to use electronic devices or go online, become withdrawn, or avoid school. Unlike traditional bullying, cyberbullying can invade safe spaces, making it difficult for victims to find relief. The 24/7 nature of online communication means that the harassment can follow victims wherever they go, leading to a sense of helplessness and despair. This can lead to an increased risk of self-harm or suicidal behaviors.

Cyberbullying Prevention

Addressing the issue of cyberbullying requires all involved (children, parents, and educators) to take a role in preventing bullying. If your child is experiencing cyberbullying, they must try not to respond. Instead, they should block/delete the individual from their devices and report it through the platform it is occurring (i.e., Snapchat, Instagram, etc.), and inform a trusted adult. Parents and educators play a crucial role in teaching children about responsible online behavior and providing support to victim.

Ultimately, combating cyberbullying requires a collective effort to create a culture of kindness and empathy online. By raising awareness about the impacts of cyberbullying and promoting positive online interactions, we can work towards a safer and more inclusive digital world for all.
