Keeping a Safe Environment with Teen Babysitters

With Summer in full swing, parishes look to teenagers to babysit for their summer programs.

By following the tips below, teenagers can become safe and responsible babysitters, providing parents with peace of mind while offering an enjoyable experience for the children in their care.

- **Get Trained:** Before starting, consider taking a babysitting training course. Many organizations offer these courses, which cover essential topics such as basic childcare, safety, first aid, and emergency preparedness. Some courses also provide certification, which can help you stand out to parents looking for a qualified babysitter.
- **Know the Basics:** Understand the fundamentals of childcare, including feeding, diapering, and age-appropriate activities. Being knowledgeable about child development can also help you engage with the children in your care more effectively.
- **Prepare for Emergencies:** Learn basic first aid techniques and know how to respond in case of emergencies such as choking, injuries, or allergic reactions. Make sure you know the emergency contact numbers and the location of nearby hospitals or urgent care centers.
