**RESPECT LIFE RETREAT** – On October 15, juniors and seniors from the Catholic high schools in our diocese will come together in Salina to learn more about the dignity of every individual. After a morning of speakers and group discussions, we will come together at Sacred Heart Cathedral for Mass, lunch and to pray a Rosary.

**SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PROCESS** – Our Catholic schools hold dual-accreditation with both the State of Kansas (KESA) and Cognia. As part of the school improvement process, we will have a few surveys for stakeholders this year. Our first survey will be the Family Survey in October. There will also be surveys throughout the year for students and teachers.

TAX CREDIT SCHOLARSHIP – Support Catholic Education in the Salina Diocese and receive a 75% State Tax Credit! The Scholarship Granting Fund for the Catholic Diocese of Salina is accepting donations and is able to offer a 75% tax credit. For the 25-26 school year, approximately \$90,000 will be awarded to schools for 120 qualifying students in the Salina Diocese. These funds go directly to help with the cost of education for the qualifying student.



Reports will be responded to promptly by the Victim Assistance Coordinator, who is available to listen, help make a formal complaint of abuse to the diocese, arrange a personal meeting with the bishop or his representative, if desired, and obtain support for the needs of the individual and their family.

#### Policy/Annual Training: Code of Conduct for Adults

The Diocese of Salina has established this Code of Conduct for clergy, employees, educators, and volunteers of the Church with regard to their contact with minors, to foster and maintain an atmosphere of trust and safety in its ministry to all minors.

Policy: Safe Environment Training/Background Check must be completed before ministry/work can begin. Diocesan personnel have a responsibility to provide a safe environment and actively protect minors from all forms of abuse and are expected to maintain the highest standards of professional, ministerial, and moral behavior. Any violation of the Diocesan Code of Conduct may be grounds for suspension, up to and including dismissal.

#### Policy: Mandatory Reporting, Suspected Abuse, Neglect, Minor in Need of Care

You must fulfill all mandatory reporting requirements. Contact the victim assistance coordinator if it relates to clergy or church personnel and inform the pastor, principal, or appropriate supervisor. This includes fully cooperating in any investigation that may occur into allegation of child sexual abuse.

If a child is in danger call 911. Any person who has reason to believe that a child is being abused or neglected can make a confidential report to the Kansas Department for Children and Families Protection Report Center.

The state provides a toll-free child abuse hotline, Kansas Department for Children and Families Hotline (DCF), 800-922-5330, along with the Kansas Bureau of Investigation (KBI) Hotline, 800-572-7463.

If there is suspected abuse by church or school personnel, in addition to reporting to civil authorities, a report must be made to the diocese. Please use:

#### Responsibilities to Diocese

- Adhere to conditions of contractual obligations with professional practice.
- Fulfill reporting requirements honestly and accurately.
- Appropriately use funds, personnel, property, and equipment.
- Refrain from falsifying documents related to the employment/benefit/payroll process.
- Conduct school/parish business through established procedures; zero falsified reports.

#### We Are Committed to Providing a Safe, Respectful Environment

We work to further Gospel values and the religious teachings that we support. Our ability to carry out our mission depends on the staff, our army of volunteers, and our relationships within our parish and community. Our conduct should always reflect positively on the diocese; we will be vigilant when minors are present and be in accord with teachings of our Catholic faith.

#### **Responsibilities to Ministry/Supervision**

- Maintain a professional relationship with parents of the students, and establish appropriate communication related to the welfare of their children.
- Ordinarily, this means having two qualified adults present, at least 21 years of age and trained.
   We refrain from allowing minors as primary supervisors over other minors.
- Adults demonstrate characteristics of honesty, diplomacy, tact, professionalism, and fairness.
- Maintain your "group" at all times no minor or adult should leave the group for unauthorized excursions. Adults must refrain from driving alone with a minor.
- Maintain proper accommodations, female and male leadership, and ratios of adults to minors for parish and school events and field trips; use the Field Trip Guide.
- Protect students by being visible at all times and using areas that are accessible; any one-on-one contact should be in a public place.

#### Appropriate mentors are:

- 1. Able to create a challenging learning environment for each individual child.
- 2. Advocates for minors physically, emotionally, spiritually, and socially.
- 3. Professionals who can express concern, empathy and encouragement, all with the right degree of authority for the situation and the individual minor.
- 4. Expected to observing appropriate boundaries, especially where contact with minors occurs.

#### **Problematic Behavior Samples**

- 1. Committing acts of cruelty or abuse or putting minors in inappropriate situations. We do not frighten, strike, or touch inappropriately.
- 2. There is zero tolerance if you provide explicit materials, use lewd gestures, engage in conduct related to anything sexual, explicit, or pornographic. We do not tolerate behavior or accept excuses that are considered by most as gross misconduct or inappropriate: guilty plea, noto contendere crime involving a minor, theft, drug-related, or anything in the State of Kansas statutes, or punishable as a felony.
- 3. We do not provide tobacco-related products, alcohol or drugs; nor do we appear at parish, school, club or any diocese-sponsored events under the influence.
- 4. We are respectful of confidential information. This applies to health matters, personal family, income, student information, academic, testing results, discipline, standardized testing protocols, test answers, etc.

In all entities of the Diocese of Salina, we shall all work in the best interest of those we minister to, work respectfully, and act professionally at all times. The responsibilities outlined in this Diocesan Code of Conduct are the minimum standards. Annual distribution of the Code of Conduct, for training purposes, is an additional reminder of our responsibility. The diocesan office, along with individual schools and parishes may have stricter requirements they must adhere to.

### What is Child Grooming?

Child grooming is a complex process involving manipulative tactics to prepare a child for sexual exploitation, abuse, or trafficking. Perpetrators often employ a gradual approach, gaining the trust of the child and those around them. If you educate yourself on the signs of child grooming, you will be more aware and able to stop the interactions before the abuse occurs.

#### **Stages of Child Grooming**

The term "sexual grooming" is used to describe the behaviors a child molester uses in preparation for committing sexual abuse on a child. An offender who uses grooming techniques is often hard to detect. They can seem friendly, helpful, and charismatic. Using these traits, they manipulate the victim, their parents, and the community. There is not one set model that predators use. Generally, the grooming process follows a series of stages, which are outlined below:

- Targeting: Perpetrators identify potential victims based on vulnerability, often exploiting their emotional or psychological needs. Children who have low selfesteem, low confidence, or are trusting and naïve are often targeted by predators due to their vulnerability.
- 2. *Befriending:* Groomers establish a connection with the child, portraying themselves as trustworthy and understanding. They may exploit shared interests or provide emotional support.
- 3. Building Trust: Groomers invest time in building trust with the child and those in their social circle, such as family members or friends. This stage aims to create a sense of security and reduce suspicion. They will often give the victim small gifts, pay special attention to them, or share secrets. Anything to make the child feel special and make them feel as though it is a caring relationship. The offender may also work on grooming the parent/guardian to not believe the child, making it seem the child is acting out or telling lies. Doing this helps reinforce their position within the child's life.
- 4. *Isolating the Child*: Perpetrators seek to isolate the child from protective figures, gradually eroding the support network that might raise concerns about their intentions. In cases where the child molester is a family member, they tend to have even easier access to the child and often the abuse takes place in the

- child's own bedroom. Access is more difficult for an abuser that is not a family member. They will usually try to put themselves in positions within the community where they can have direct access to children.
- 5. Introducing Sexual Content: Groomers progressively introduce sexually explicit content or discussions to desensitize the child and test their boundaries. In the beginning, the offender will do more non-sexual touching such as hugs, snuggles, tickling, and or wrestling. They may also start having talks with the minor about sexual behaviors to make them more comfortable with that type of content.
- 6. *Maintaining Control:* The groomer establishes control over the child through emotional manipulation, threats, or blackmail, making it difficult for the child to disclose the abuse.

These grooming techniques are used to manipulate the child, so they believe the abuser is their "friend" and will be less likely to speak up about what is going on for fear of getting their "friend" in trouble. Offenders also use these steps and trust from the family to harbor doubt in the victim's story if they ever come forward. This type of abuse is often missed because it occurs gradually, and a lot of the steps taken by the abuser can appear harmless and even friendly.

#### **Preventing Child Grooming**

Preventing child grooming requires a comprehensive approach involving education, awareness, and collaboration among various stakeholders. Knowing the steps predators take can go a long way in keeping children safe. It is important to keep open lines of communication with children. They should feel that you believe and trust what they say. The following are some helpful tips to keep in mind:

- No outings/overnights with adults if the child will be the only one.
- Minors with cell phones should not communicate (talk, text, email, social media) with other adults unless it is in a group message format. Check with your Arch/Dioceses social media policy and protocol.
- Encourage open lines of communication. Let the child know keeping secrets with another adult is wrong.
- Be wary of adults who show frequent special attention to a single child. Gifts or treats should not be given if it is not to the whole group.
- Keep an eye out for anyone who touches a child unnecessarily. Some sporting activities require body position corrections or for spotting purposes; however, if the touching makes the child feel uncomfortable, let them know to talk to you and or ask the coach to stop.

Child grooming has profound and lasting effects on the victims, both psychologically and emotionally. Victims may experience feelings of guilt, shame, and confusion, often blaming themselves for the abuse. The breach of trust can have severe consequences on their ability to form healthy relationships in the future. Additionally, the trauma may manifest in mental health issues, including anxiety, depression, and post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD). A minor will not be able to recognize the signs unless they know about them beforehand. Even then, the steps happen over time, so the child may not be able to put together what is happening. Not every child molester uses grooming practices, however, about half do. If you catch a person attempting to lure a child, you should always speak up. While sexual grooming may not be sexual abuse in some contexts, it is a standalone criminal offense. It is difficult to know for sure when grooming is happening, so knowing the steps, and watching for warning signs will help prevent abuse from happening.


