LENT SERIES - Advent 2024, Bishop Vincke invited every parish in the diocese to enter more deeply into the Acts XXIX framework (Created – Captured – Rescued – Response). We were then fortunate to welcome Fr. John Riccardo and the Acts XXIX Team to our Diocesan conference in August, where they helped us deepen our understanding of the heart of The Rescue Project.

As we move into Lent, we are encouraging every parish to take the next step by hosting or forming small groups to experience The Rescue Project together.

Small groups are one of the most effective ways to help parishioners encounter Jesus personally, build authentic community, and deepen their understanding of the Gospel. Even two or three people gathering in a home, classroom, or parish hall can make a real difference.

Parishes can use existing groups—men's groups, women's groups, Bible studies, RCIA teams—or create new Lenten small groups explicitly built around this experience. Families can also participate together at home.

#iGIVECATHOLIC 2025 - 28 organizations in our diocese had a hugely successful #iGiveCatholic Giving Day on Tuesday December 2nd. Participating organizations in our diocese were able to raise \$782,827! Thank you to everyone for their dedication, hard work, and efforts – which were clearly rewarded through another successful #iGiveCatholic campaign.

Some quick stats regarding the 2025 campaign -

- The Diocese of Salina ranked 6th overall out of 40 participating dioceses.
- We had 867 donors this year.
- Two organizations ranked in the top 50 in the nation Comeau Catholic Campus Center (14th), St. John's Catholic School Beloit (23rd)
- Six more organizations finished in the top 100 in the nation St. Thomas More (Manhattan, Kansas), St. Andrew Church (Abilene), Manhattan Catholic Schools, Sacred Heart Grade School (Plainville), St. Mary Church and School (Ellis), and St. Andrew Grade School (Abilene).

COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIPS - Great news for students in the Diocese of Salina! There are three scholarship opportunities available for the 2026-2027 school year. The application process is online and opened on **Nov. 1, 2025**. Students are encouraged to apply by **March 1st, 2026** at **givecfds.org/scholarships**.

- **Monsignor Clement A. Kruse Scholarship** Applicant must be an active registered member of a Catholic parish in the Diocese of Salina. These scholarships are approximately \$500.
- Marymount Memorial Educational Trust Scholarship Applicant must be attending an accredited Catholic College as a full-time student and an active registered member of a Catholic parish in the Diocese of Salina. These scholarships vary but ranged from \$1,000-\$3,000.
- Susie Deges Scholarship This scholarship is specifically for high school seniors in the diocese who are active in their local CYO (Catholic Youth Organization). This scholarship is \$1,000.

OFFICE OF EDUCATION

KAIRS EDUCATOR OF THE YEAR for the Salina Diocese – Jennie Helget – JH Math Teachers, Thomas More Prep - Marian, was named the recipient of the KAIRS Educator of the Year for the Salina Diocese. She will be recognized at the annual KAIRS Banquet in February in Topeka.

CATHOLIC SCHOOLS & CATHOLIC CHARITIES PARTNERSHIP – February 16 - March 6, students at our schools will be filling baby bottle banks with quarters to raise money for Catholic Charities. This is a great way to not only raise money, but to also raise awareness about the needs in our communities.

TAX CREDIT SCHOLARSHIP – Support Catholic Education in the Salina Diocese and receive a 75% State Tax Credit! The Scholarship Granting Fund for the Catholic Diocese of Salina is accepting donations and is able to offer a 75% tax credit. Please email Heather Hartman, Chief Executive Officer for the Catholic Foundation heather.hartman@salinadiocese.org. For the 25-26 school year, approximately \$90,000 was awarded to schools for 120 qualifying students in the Salina Diocese. These funds go directly to help with the cost of education for the qualifying student.

OFFICE OF EDUCATION (cont.)

Example - Bob has an upcoming 2025 KS State Income tax obligation of \$750. Top fulfill this obligation, he can EITHER:

- 1. Write a check to the KS Dept of Revenue in the amount of \$750 or
- 2. Write a check to the Scholarship Granting Fund for the Diocese of Salina for \$1,000, receive a "KS Tax Credit Certificate" to fulfill 100% of Bob's 2024 KS Income Tax obligation.

ANY individual income taxpayer, corporate income taxpayer, privilege taxpayer or insurance premium taxpayers are eligible for the tax credit

Please consult your tax advisor to see if this is right for you.

OFFICE OF YOUTH MINISTRY AND RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

LENT SERIES FOR YOUTH GROUPS (Junior High or High School) - Advent 2024, Bishop Vincke invited our entire diocese to enter more deeply into the Acts XXIX framework (Created – Captured – Rescued – Response). We were blessed to welcome Fr. John Riccardo and the Acts XXIX Team to our diocesan conference in August, where we heard the powerful message behind The Rescue Project. This message speaks directly to the hearts of young people today.

As we move into Lent, we want to especially encourage middle school and high school youth groups to experience The Rescue Project in small groups.

Youth are hungry for real conversation, authentic friendships, and a deeper sense of purpose. Small groups provide the perfect environment, safe, relational, and engaging—for teens to wrestle with the big questions of life and faith.

CYO groups can use their normal meeting times or form temporary Lenten small groups that meet in classrooms, youth rooms, or even homes. The format is simple: watch a video, talk about it, pray together, and build community.

All videos, guides, and easy-to-use materials will be available on our diocesan website by January 15.

HOW TO DONATE MEAT:

- **CALL AHEAD**

Call ahead to ensure we have freezer space.

- WHAT WE ACCEPT

We accept beef, pork, poultry, or venison (must be USDA or stateinspected).

- PROPER PACKAGING

Meat must be properly packaged and labeled for food safety.

DROP-OFF LOCATIONS

Bring donations to our Salina, Manhattan, or Hays offices.

HELP FEED HUNGRY FAMILIES

- Provide nutritious meals to families receiving our food boxes who can't afford meat, making balanced meals difficult.
- Ease financial struggles for those forced to choose between essentials like rent and protein-rich food.
- Support local families across northern Kansas by ensuring they have access to quality meat.
