Please send in the names and addresses and specify if they are Candidates or Catechumens (please use only these Titles). Please be sure the spellings are correct. Submit the information to coady@stmmmanhattan.com.

Please respond no later than Friday, February 13, for Salina and Friday, February 20, for Hays. This will afford time for the invitation letters to be generated and signed by Bishop Vincke and mailed. Also indicate which location they will attend the Rite of Election. Those names sent after the deadline may not receive a letter of invitation from the bishop, but they will still be welcome to participate in the Rite of Election.

If a person is already Catholic and is completing Confirmation only, they do not go through the Rite of Election. Remember that the Rite of Election is for those joining the Church, not those already Catholic.

If a youth is younger than age 7, the youth does not go through the Rite of Election.

Please note on your list if any people are related and what that relationship is. The bishop will send a personal letter of invitation to each Candidate and Catechumen. The letter is available in English and Spanish. Please indicate if you want the letter sent in Spanish (or Spanish and English) to any individuals.

Thank you for sending the above information which will help the Liturgy Office plan these celebrations.

At the Rite of Election, OCIA Directors will present the catechumens and candidates to the bishop. Announce them in the following manner. I present for baptism (names). I present for full communion (names). You will then give your Book of Elect to the bishop for his signature.

Through these events, schools focus on the value Catholic education provides to young people and its contributions to our church, our communities, and our nation. This year's theme is Catholic Schools: United in Faith and Community. Bishop Vincke will be celebrating Mass with all the students throughout the week in our communities.

KAIRS EDUCATOR OF THE YEAR FOR THE SALINA DIOCESE: Jennie Helget – J.H. Math Teachers, Thomas More Prep - Marian, was named the recipient of the KAIRS Educator of the Year for the Salina Diocese. She will be recognized at the annual KAIRS Banquet in February in Topeka.

KAIRS ANNUAL ADMINISTRATORS CONFERENCE - Superintendent Geoff Andrews will serve as the keynote speaker at the 2026 Kansas Association of Independent and Religious Schools (KAIRS) Annual Administrators Conference, held February 9–10 in Topeka. Geoff will lead conference participants through *The 7 Commitments of a Great Team*, offering practical leadership insights rooted in strong culture, teamwork, and mission-driven schools.

CATHOLIC SCHOOLS & CATHOLIC CHARITIES PARTNERSHIP – February 16 - March 6, students at our schools will be filling baby bottle banks with quarters to raise money for Catholic Charities. This is a great way to not only raise money, but to also raise awareness about the needs in our communities.

75% TAX CREDIT SCHOLARSHIP – Kansas Tax Credit Scholarship - The Scholarship Granting Fund for the Catholic Diocese of Salina offers donors an opportunity to support Catholic education while receiving a 75% Kansas State income tax credit through the *Kansas Tax Credit for Low Income Students Scholarship Program*.

- Important statewide update: For the first time since this program began, the State of Kansas has reached the annual \$10 million cap on available tax credits. This cap applies to all participating Scholarship Granting Organizations (SGOs) serving private, accredited schools across Kansas. Once the cap is reached, no additional tax-credit-eligible contributions can be accepted for that calendar year.
- What this means for donors: Tax credits are issued on a first-come, first-served basis and reset each year on January 1. Because the statewide cap was reached this year, donors who wish to take advantage of the tax credit in the future are encouraged not to wait until October, November, or December, but instead to plan their gift early in the calendar year.
- Impact locally: For the 2025–2026 school year, approximately \$90,000 was awarded through the Scholarship Granting Fund to Catholic schools in the Salina Diocese, assisting 120 qualifying students. These scholarship funds go directly to families to help offset the cost of a Catholic education.
- Eligible donors may include individual income taxpayers, corporate income taxpayers, privilege taxpayers, and insurance premium taxpayers, subject to state guidelines. Donors are encouraged to consult their tax advisor to determine whether this opportunity is appropriate for their tax situation.

How the Kansas SGO Tax Credit Works – Example:

Bob has an upcoming 2025 Kansas State income tax obligation of \$7,500.

To fulfill this obligation, Bob can either:

Write a check to the Kansas Department of Revenue in the amount of \$7,500, or

Write a check to the Scholarship Granting Fund for the Catholic Diocese of Salina in the amount of \$10,000 and receive a Kansas Tax Credit Certificate for 75% of the donation (\$7,500), which fulfills 100% of Bob's Kansas State income tax obligation.

As a result, Bob directs his state tax dollars to support Catholic school students and families rather than sending those dollars entirely to the state.

*****ANY individual income taxpayer, corporate income taxpayer, privilege taxpayer or insurance premium taxpayers are eligible for the tax credit*****

CATHOLIC SCHOOLS BABY BOTTLE CAMPAIGN - From February 16 – March 6, Salina Diocese Catholic Schools will participate in the 2nd annual Baby Bottle Campaign to support Catholic Charities Pregnancy Support & Adoption Programs.

How it works: Each classroom in every Catholic school within the diocese will receive a large baby bottle. During the three-week campaign, everyone is encouraged to bring in spare change, cash, or checks to help fill the bottles. LENT SERIES - Advent 2024, Bishop Vincke invited every parish in the diocese to enter more deeply into the Acts XXIX framework (Created – Captured – Rescued – Response). We were then fortunate to welcome Fr. John Riccardo and the Acts XXIX Team to our diocesan conference in August, where they helped us deepen our understanding of the heart of The Rescue Project. As we move into Lent, we are encouraging every parish to take the next step by hosting or forming small groups to experience The Rescue Project together.

Small groups are one of the most effective ways to help parishioners encounter Jesus personally, build authentic community, and deepen their understanding of the Gospel. Even two or three people gathering in a home, classroom, or parish hall can make a real difference.

Parishes can use existing groups—men’s groups, women’s groups, Bible studies, RCIA teams—or create new Lenten small groups explicitly built around this experience. Families can also participate together at home.

COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIPS - Great news for students in the Diocese of Salina! There are three scholarship opportunities available for the 2026-2027 school year. The application process is online and opened on Nov. 1, 2025. Students are encouraged to apply by **March 1st, 2026**, at givecfds.org/scholarships.

- **Monsignor Clement A. Kruse Scholarship** - Applicant must be an active registered member of a Catholic parish in the Diocese of Salina. These scholarships are approximately \$500.
- **Marymount Memorial Educational Trust Scholarship** - Applicant must be attending an accredited Catholic College as a full-time student and an active registered member of a Catholic parish in the Diocese of Salina. These scholarships vary but ranged from \$1,000-\$3,000.
- **Susie Deges Scholarship** - This scholarship is specifically for high school seniors in the diocese who are active in their local CYO (Catholic Youth Organization). This scholarship is \$1,000.

OFFICE OF YOUTH MINISTRY AND RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

LENT SERIES FOR YOUTH GROUPS (Junior High or High School) - Advent 2024, Bishop Vincke invited our entire diocese to enter more deeply into the Acts XXIX framework (Created – Captured – Rescued – Response). We were blessed to welcome Fr. John Riccardo and the Acts XXIX Team to our diocesan conference in August, where we heard the powerful message behind The Rescue Project. This message speaks directly to the hearts of young people today.

As we move into Lent, we want to especially encourage middle school and high school youth groups to experience The Rescue Project in small groups.

Youth are hungry for real conversation, authentic friendships, and a deeper sense of purpose. Small groups provide the perfect environment, safe, relational, and engaging—for teens to wrestle with the big questions of life and faith.

CYO groups can use their normal meeting times or form temporary Lenten small groups that meet in classrooms, youth rooms, or even homes. The format is simple: watch a video, talk about it, pray together, and build community.

All videos, guides, and easy-to-use materials will be available on our diocesan website by January 15.


