SACRED HEART & MARGARET MARY ALACOQUE

Margaret Mary Alacoque was a French nun born in 1647. Her feast day is October 17th. During her childhood, after her dad and sister died, she was hurt by adults who were supposed to keep her safe. They wanted her to get married, but she knew she wanted to enter religious life. When she turned 23, she joined the Order of the Visitation nuns at Paray. While praying in front of the Blessed Sacrament one day, she saw Jesus and his heart! It was on fire for love of all of us! Jesus asked St. Margaret Mary and her confessor, St. Claude de Colombière, to spread this love to everyone through the image of his sacred heart.

How To CONSECRATE YOUR HOME

1. Prepare your home and hearts

2. Gather for prayer

Get the family together. You can even invite a priest or deacon to join!

3. Proclaim the Word of God

John 19:31-37, which tells about the pierced heart of Jesus, might help us think more deeply about the mysteries of God

4. Pray the Act of Consecration

Say a consecration prayer (parents - you can find one by scanning the QR code) or say a prayer from the heart to dedicate your home and family to the Sacred and Immaculate Hearts

5. Enthroned the images

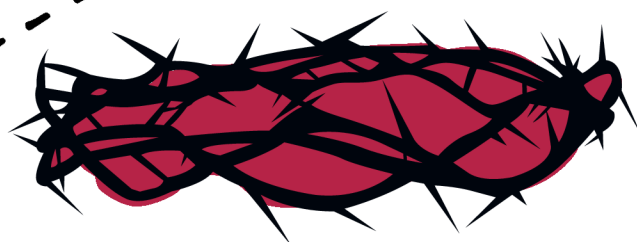
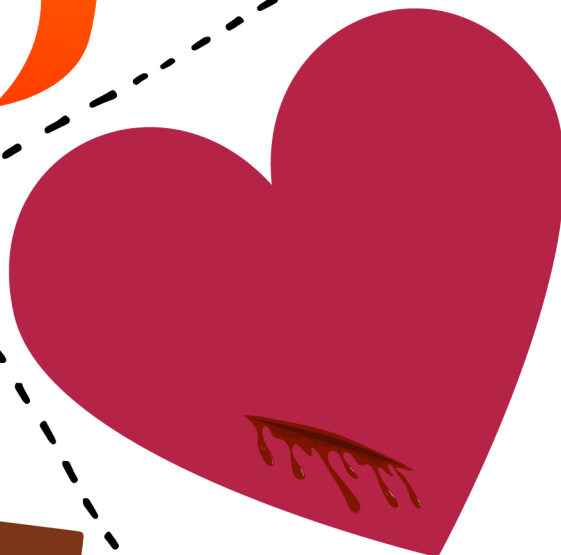
Place the picture(s) in their place of honor to remind you of Christ's love for you & his love for the world
